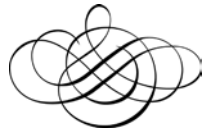

CONSIDER CAREFULLY AND PRAYERFULLY

We have seen how difficult guidance can be to discern and how godly Christians, with the best of intentions, can arrive at different (even opposing) conclusions. One thing must be clear, however: a path must not be avoided simply because it is a difficult one. We should listen to, and carefully evaluate, the advice that others may give us. We must weigh what they say carefully. And our goal must be to follow the path that God has set for us. Once we have arrived at a conclusion as to the direction of that path, we must ensure that we walk down the path with faith and a good conscience. That path may even call upon us to make great sacrifices. It may even be a path that could lead to our death. Are we prepared to take such a path if God calls upon us to take it? Is our love for Jesus great enough that we would be prepared to risk our very lives for Him? This is a haunting question to be considered carefully and prayerfully.

And he said to me, “Take and eat it; it will make your stomach bitter, but in your mouth it will be sweet as honey.” ¹⁰ And I took the little scroll from the hand of the angel and ate it. It was sweet as honey in my mouth, but when I had eaten it my stomach was made bitter. ¹¹ And I was told, “You must again prophesy about many peoples and nations and languages and kings.”
