Luke 23:26-28

And as they led Him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus. And there followed Him a great multitude of the people and of women who were mourning and lamenting for Him. But turning

to them Jesus said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for Me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For behold, the days are coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren and the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us,' and to the hills, 'Cover us.' For if they do these things when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?" Two others, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with Him. And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified Him, and the criminals, one on His right and one on His left. And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide His garments. And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at Him, saying, "He saved others; let Him save Himself, if He is the Christ of God, His Chosen One!" The soldiers also mocked Him, coming up and offering Him sour wine and saying, "If You are the King of the Jews, save Yourself!" There was also an inscription over Him, "This is the King of the Jews."





Rev. Dr. Jonathan Gibson

Today, we welcome Rev. Dr. Jonathan Gibson as our guest minister. Dr. Gibson is Associate Professor of Old Testament at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. He holds a PhD in Hebrew Studies, from Girton College, Cambridge University. He is an ordained teaching elder in the International Presbyterian Church, UK, and previously served as associate minister at Cambridge Presbyterian Church in England. He was Lecturer in Biblical Theology in the Christian Heritage Apprenticeship Program in Cambridge from 2013–2015.

Dr. Gibson is a contributor to and co-editor (with David Gibson) of *From Heaven He Came and Sought Her: Definite Atonement in Historical, Biblical, Theological, and Pastoral Perspective*. He is also the author of historical and biblical articles in *Themelios, Journal of Biblical Literature*, and *Tyndale Bulletin*, as well as "Obadiah" in the *NIV Proclamation Bible*.

He authored *Be Thou My Vision: A Liturgy for Daily Worship* and several children's books including *The Moon Is Always Round, The Acrostic of God,* and *The Acrostic of Jesus*.
