Sermon Title

#### Devotional Notes: Preparing to Meet God

"Israel's rebellion and unfruitfulness brought about judgment. One must never take for granted the grace God bestows through His invitation. We can be like Pharaoh in Moses' day, Israel in Amos' day, or the Pharisees in Jesus' day who hardened their hearts until it was no longer possible to come to God, or we can be like the tax collector who prayed, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner' (Luke 18:13). Quoting Psalm 95:7-8 the writer of Hebrews says, 'Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts' (Heb 4:70)."
