As American Presbyterians, we celebrate many aspects of our Reformation heritage. The hallmark event on October 31, 1517, with Martin Luther nailing the 95 Theses to the Castle Church of Wittenburg is honored with the singing of "A Mighty Fortress Is our God." Our most direct heritage, as Presbyterians, is the Scottish tradition, which we see with the use of bagpipes and the singing of psalms. Lastly, our English heritage, which provided the Westminster Confession, is found in our order of worship, which follows the 1662 Book of Common Praver. marking its 350th anniversary this year. The prayer book's predecessors date the reign of Edward VI (1547-1553), and the Calvinist heritage of the English Reformation is thoroughly intact in the 1662 version, which is still used today throughout the This volume and its predecessors have been the foundational prayer books for Presbyterians, Anglicans, and Methodists, as well as other traditions, including our own Patrick Curles' edition of The Book of Common Worship.
