WHY EVENING WORSHIP

In a day when *evening worship* has been all but put aside and forgotten by many churches, at Trinity Church "you'll always find the light on" and the people of God gathered to end the Lord's Day together in worship. When one drives down South Hull or Felder at the six o'clock hour on a Sunday, they will find cars lining the street and filling the parking lot; and the neighbor walking his/her dog will hear singing and preaching and fellowship. It is sweet; it is peaceful; it is genuine; and it is a wonderful way to close the Lord's Day and begin a new week.

THE DUTY

Like any Christian discipline, there is a sense of duty attached to *evening worship*; a sense of *oughtness*. There is a Scriptural pattern of morning and evening sacrifice [e.g., Exodus 29:38-39]; there is the pattern of David in his prayer life [Psalm 5:3; 141:2]; as well, the apostles, the early church, and our Reformed heritage all point to a pattern of evening worship. It is a venerable Christian tradition.

Not only so, morning and evening worship services on the Lord's Day provide a rhythm on the Sabbath that helps one combat the modern notion that the Lord's Day is "MY day," or "MY family's day," or "just another Saturday." Worshipping morning and evening will aide an individual and/or family in keeping the whole day hallow, rather than simply one hour on Sunday morning.

Each member of Trinity Church has taken a vow (a solemn promise) to God and before God and His people stating, "I will support the worship of the church to the best of my ability." This is not said of Sunday School. It is not said of Wednesday nights. It is not said of small groups or Bible studies or WIC meetings or committee meetings. It IS said of worship, and Trinity worships morning and evening on the Sabbath. [Exodus 20:8-11; Isaiah 58:13-14; Hebrews 10:23-25; see also Mark 2: 25-28]

THE PRIVILEGE

What a gift from God to you to belong to a church that embraces the whole day as sacred! What a privilege to have a minister prepare to preach the Word to you on the Lord's Day evening! What better place would mom and dad find their family than shoulder-to-shoulder in the pew worshipping God; training up that child in the nurture and fear of the Lord!

Sunday Evening Worship at Trinity provides: the means of grace, preaching, prayer, communion, fellowship, camaraderie, intimacy, a family feel, accountability, love, joy, peace, and grace. Children are catechized. The week gets off to a good start. Spiritual growth is enhanced. It is the perfect end to a day set aside for Him Who has actually given it to us for our good.

We were made for worship. Our hearts are restless until they find their rest in God. He seeks our worship and longs for our fellowship. Is there a greater privilege? Is there something competing for our time on His Day that compares to the eternal impact evening worship would have on us and our families?

SUBTLE CHANGES IN EVENING WORSHIP AT TRINITY

Beginning November 4 you will have two options for prayer and/or preparation beginning at 5:45 p.m. If you would like to pray with the ministers in the Westminster Room, they will welcome you. Also at 5:45 prelude music will begin that will include not only organ, piano and other instruments, but also solos, ensembles and congregational singing. Also note: all children will be fed a hot meal. And our liturgy will slightly shift to more congregational involvement, testimonies, youth choir leadership, and the like.

Please make evening worship a part of yours and your family's godly habits and priorities for the glory of God and your own good.
