

- ◀ The Lord's Prayer, though not an exhaustive prayer, serves as a model prayer providing us with a certain priority in our praying: His Name, His Kingdom, His will, my needs, confession/forgiveness, daily Christian fight/protection, God's glory!

◆ This vital means of God's grace to us is a key element in the worship of God.

translated into German in 1656 by

Lutheran hymn writer, Paul

James W. Alexander.

1830 by Presbyterian minister,

◀ The text to "A Debtor to Mercy Alone" was written by Augustus Toplady, the Calvinist Anglican minister who was known for his opposition to the Arminian teachings of John Wesley. Toplady wrote many other hymns, "Rock of Ages" being among the most well-known. This text reminds us that the believer is secure by the sovereign grace of God.

Beloved in the Lord, attend to the Words of Institution of the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, as they are delivered by the Apostle Paul: "I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when He was betrayed took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, "This is My body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same way also He took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."

- ◀ The Words of Institution are the scriptural warrant for the administration of the Sacrament. They not only authorize the administration but also contain the promise of grace to those who receive the sacrament by faith (Westminster Confession of Faith 27:3).
- ◆ Through the preaching of
 Scripture, God addresses our mind
 and conscience through hearing. In
 the sacraments, He uniquely
 addresses our mind and conscience
 through the other senses. We see,
 smell, touch and taste the Word.

◀ Quietly and privately preach the truth of God's Word to yourself in these closing moments of the service.
