Conflict, according to Ken Sande in his helpful book, The Peacemaker: A Biblical Guide to Resolving Personal Conflict, can arise in one of four ways. There is what he calls "differences of values, goals, gifts, calling, priorities, expectations, interests, or opinions," a category in which he includes this incident [Acts 15]. In addition, he cites three others: misunderstandings arising from poor communications, competition over limited resources such as time or money, and sinful attitudes and habits that lead to sinful words and actions. Sande does not see in this incident a sinful attitude as such (that Barnabas was playing family favorites, or that Paul was nursing a grudge following the table-fellowship debacle at Antioch.) For Sande, this is an example of two men who come to different judgments about the best way forward, given the data available to them. One requires more time for personal growth; another thinks an immediate second chance worth the risk.


