The Litany for the Nation

O God the Father, Who governs the nations upon the earth: **Be merciful to us.**

Remember not, O Lord, the offenses of Your people, our manifold transgressions and our national sins; deal not with us after our sins, neither reward us according to our wickedness:

Spare us, Father of Mercies.

From blindness of heart, from love of ease, from contentment with the second best, from failure to do the good that was in the heart of our fathers and for which they prepared the way:

Save Your people, Lord.

From presumptuous sins, from pride of possession, from vainglorious boastings, from national hypocrisies:

Save Your people, Lord.

✓ Almighty God has promised forgiveness of sin to everyone who turns to Him in true repentance and faith. If you have received Christ as He is freely offered in the Gospel, are resting in Him alone for salvation, and are resolved to live in obedience to Christ, then your sins are forgiven. Receive this Good News by faith and believe it!

✓ A litany is a series of petitions followed with congregational responses.

✓ Opening hymns are typically joyous hymns. We remind ourselves of all the reasons we have to praise our God.

✓ The focus of this prayer is not petition, but magnifying and glorifying the being and work of God. We invoke (i.e., appeal for) God's presence, which He promises. From the covetousness which is idolatry, from false bargaining and ruthless competition, and from all the service of mammon and the worship of wealth: **Save Your people, Lord.**

From obsession with our own predjudice, bigotries, and antagonism:

Save Your people, Lord.

From failure to take into account the needs of others, from living unto ourselves alone, and from putting our trust in our own strength when our trust should be in You:

Save Your people, Lord.

That we may hallow Your name, that we may seek first Your kingdom and Your righteousness; and that, as You give us to know Your will, so we may do it:

We beseech You to hear us, Good Lord.

That we may be mindful of the poor and the oppressed among us; that we may bring up the children of the nation in Your faith and fear:

We beseech You to hear us, Good Lord.

That we make choice of just legislators and faithful counselors, who with a godly spirit may enact always things just, and things wise, and things merciful:

We beseech You to hear us, Good Lord.

Almighty God, Who turns the heart of the fathers to their children, and the heart of the children to their fathers: receive, we pray You, our unfeigned thanks for the good land which You have given us. Forgive our transgressions; cleanse us from things that defile our national life, and grant that this people, which You have abundantly blessed, may keep Your commandments, walk in Your ways, and fear You. Be gracious to our times, that by Your bounty both national quietness and Christian devotion may be duly maintained. Let Your work appear unto Your servants, and Your glory unto their children; and let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us and establish the work of our hands upon us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
