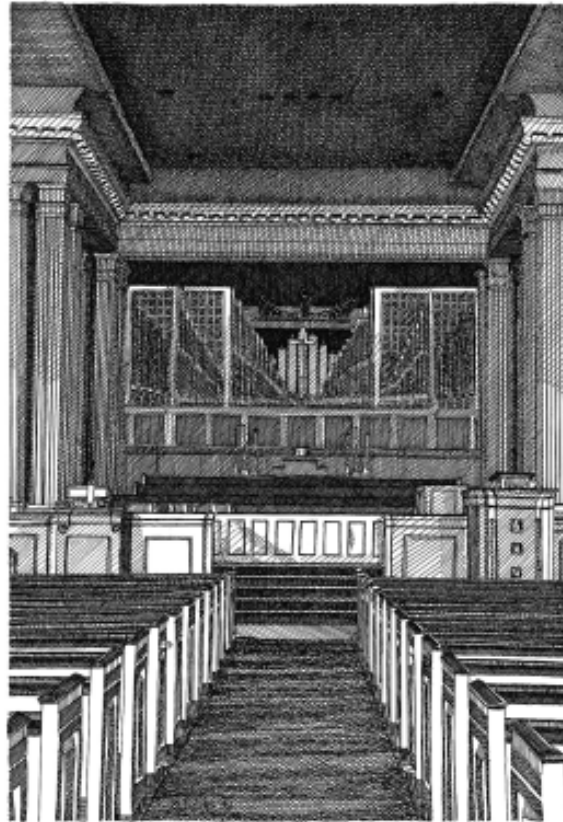

◀ Paul, Peter and the writer of Hebrews all exhort God’s people to show hospitality. Jesus tells us in Matthew that kindness to strangers is kindness to Him. Be sure to introduce yourself and welcome any unfamiliar faces you see.

◀ Focusing on God as He reveals Himself in Scripture and on His mighty acts for us, in this prayer we name the God we worship—Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. We hallow His name, claim Him as our God and confess that we are His people.

The Corporate Confession of Sin

Minister: Father, when I kept silent about my sin, my bones wasted away.

People: Then I acknowledged my sin to You and did not cover up my iniquity, and You forgave the guilt of my sin.

Minister: If You, O Lord, kept a record of sins, who could stand before You?

People: But with You there is forgiveness; therefore, You are feared.

Minister: I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against You, and You only, have I sinned and done what is evil in Your sight.

People: You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, You will not despise.

Minister: Therefore let the godly pray to You while You may be found.

People: You are our hiding place; You will protect us from trouble and surround us with songs of deliverance.

◀ The praises of these covenant children as they lead us in worship are a sweet smelling aroma to our Heavenly Father.

◀ During His ministry Jesus took time to pray and bless children. In a culture that placed little value on small children, this was surprising, if not a revolutionary practice for a respected teacher to condescend in such a manner (see Matthew 19:13-14). Jesus loves children.

◀ Children aged four through kindergarten may leave to attend Children’s Church. Following the worship service, please pick up your children from the Children’s Chapel in the Covenant Building (E-100).

◀ We are the people of God, but Scripture reminds us that we still sin. We need to confess our failures, knowing that the Lord Jesus intercedes for us with the Father, who freely forgives us, through His never-ending grace and mercy. So let us draw near to God with sincerity and confidence, and pray together.

“In a surge of anger I hid My face from you for a moment, but with everlasting kindness I will have compassion on you,” says the Lord, your Redeemer.

Conclusion

◀ In 1 Corinthians 16:2 Paul says: “On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper...” This practice of collecting was continued as a regular part of public worship. Justin Martyr, around A.D. 150 describes such a collection. The collection is both for the maintenance of the church and for the care of those in need, and it affirms that we are stewards, not owners, of God's good gifts. We also praise God in song for His goodness towards us all the time.

◀ Biblical preaching strives for the one meaning to the text while making modern-day application to the hearer.
