Lift High the Cross

A Trinity Church favorite, this hymn is sung at many funerals, an occasional bridal procession, and other services throughout the year, the least of which not being our annual Missions Conference. And what a testimony to a church to sing as a hallmark attribute: *Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim, till all the world adore His sacred name!*

Ponder: *The ground is level at the foot of the cross.*

And further consider: *You are more sinful than you ever dared imagine, but you are more loved in Christ than you ever dared dream.*

Why? Simply, the events of the cross. An innocent man dying a sinner's death. Blood. Mockery. Beatings. Unfair trials. Betrayal. Shame. Family and at least one friend looking on. Words uttered. The turning away of the Father. Darkness. The torn curtain. A soldier's bewilderment. An atonement. A sacrificial lamb. A substitute. Love proclaimed. Victory.

Go there. *Follow where our Savior trod.*

But also, ACT! Do something! Allow the cross to move you to reach the world with the gospel. Ask God to use you to make *His Kingdom come, that earth's despair may cease beneath the shadow of the cross's healing peace!*

How might you give thanks to God for the cross? What might you do for someone else this week that proves your tender heart toward others wrought by the love of your Savior on the cross? And may we all sing together as God's family in worship on this Lord's Day, March 24, as we lift our voices singing, *Lift High the Cross.*
