The Old Testament Lesson

Exodus 13:21-22; Numbers 9:17-23

21 And the Lord went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead them along the way, and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, that they might travel by day and by night. 22 The pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night did not depart from before the people.

17 And whenever the cloud lifted from over the tent, after that the people of Israel set out, and in the place where the cloud settled down, there the people of Israel camped. 18 At the command of the Lord the people of Israel set out, and at the command of the Lord they camped. As long as the cloud rested over the tabernacle, they remained in camp. 19 Even when the cloud continued over the tabernacle many days, the people of Israel kept the charge of the Lord and did not set out. 20 Sometimes the cloud was a few days over the tabernacle, and according to the command of the Lord they remained in camp; then according to the command of the Lord they set out. 21 And sometimes the cloud remained from evening until morning. And when the cloud lifted in the morning, they set out, or if it continued for a day and a night, when the cloud lifted they set out. 22 Whether it was two days, or a month, or a longer time, that the cloud continued over the tabernacle, abiding there, the people of Israel remained in camp and did not set out, but when it lifted they set out. 23 At the command of the Lord they camped, and at the command of the Lord they set out. They kept the charge of the Lord, at the command of the Lord by Moses.

The New Testament Lesson

John 8:12-30

12 Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I Am the Light of the World. Whoever follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." 13 So the Pharisees said to Him, "You are bearing witness about yourself; Your testimony is not true." 14 Jesus answered, "Even if I do bear witness about Myself, My testimony is true, for I know where I came from and where I am going, but you do not know where I come from or where I am going. 15 You judge according to the flesh; I judge no one. 16 Yet even if I do judge, My judgment is true, for it is not I alone Who judge, but I and the Father Who sent Me.

17 In your Law it is written that the testimony of two people is true. 18 I am the one Who bears witness about Myself, and the Father Who sent Me bears witness about Me." 19 They said to Him therefore, "Where is Your Father?" Jesus answered, "You know neither Me nor My Father. If you knew Me, you would know My Father also." 20 These words He spoke in the treasury, as He taught in the temple; but no one arrested Him, because His hour had not yet come. 21 So He said to them again, "I am going away, and you will seek Me, and you will die in your sin. Where I am going, you cannot come." 22 So the Jews said, "Will He kill himself, since He says, 'Where I am going, you cannot come'?" 23 He said to them, "You are from below; I am from above. You are of this world; I am not of this world. 24 I told you that you would die in your sins, for unless you believe that I am He you will die in your sins." 25 So they said to Him, "Who are You?" Jesus said to them, "Just what I have been telling you from the beginning. 26 I have much to say about you and much to judge, but He Who sent me is true, and I declare to the world what I have heard from Him." 27 They did not understand that He had been speaking to them about the Father. 28 So Jesus said to them, "When you have lifted up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, and that I do nothing on My own authority, but speak just as the Father taught Me. 29 And He Who sent Me is with Me. He has not left Me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to Him." 30 As He was saving these things, many believed in Him.
