- 1. ... reveals to me an entire approach to ministry!
- 2. ... bestows on me a real sense of freedom, comfort and encouragement.
- 3. ... assures me my soul WILL be ministered unto.
- 4. ... comforts me that the man in the pulpit takes the Bible seriously.
- 5. ... comforts me that the man in the pulpit takes preaching seriously.
- 6. ... guarantees me the Holy Spirit will empower the preacher and apply the Word to my heart.

7. ... encourages me that the church to which I belong will witness first-hand conversion growth.

8. ... is a humbling invitation to partake in "II Corinthians 2 ministry."

9. ... emboldens me knowing the church to which I belong is all about what Jesus was all about: preaching the Word.

10. ... grants peace that the church to which I belong will not start down a slippery slope into liberalism.

11. ... is an invitation to enter into a truth-trust relationship with the minister in the pulpit: I trust him to show me Jesus ... to take me to the cross as well as an empty tomb; he trusts me to engage expectantly ... to prayerfully apply the Word of God.

12. ... pushes me to know more of what the Word of God says about the Word of God:

Psalm 33:6, 119:147-148; Isaiah 40:8; Matthew 4:4; Luke 4:18; John 1:3, 7:38, 6:35, 15:7; Acts 6:1-4, 7, 12:24, 13:49, 17:11, 19:20; Romans 10:14-17; Ephesians 5:26; I Thessalonians 2:13; I Timothy 4:13-14; II Timothy 3:15-17; Titus 1:3; 2:13; Hebrews 1:3, 4:12; I Peter 1:23
