



Bill's role as Interim Minister is part of the transition plan adopted by the Session. The plan includes:

- 1. The retention of Flourish Coaching to help guide us through the transition process, including conducting a self-assessment, development of the church profile, development of the new minister profile, and assisting the Senior Minister Search Committee. Many of you have assisted Flourish in these tasks by responding to the congregational survey or participating in limited in-person interviews.
- 2. For the past few months, Dr. Richard Pratt has helped fill the pulpit on an interim basis. Richard's last sermon will be April 30. We are deeply grateful for his commitment to, and support of, Trinity Church.
- 3. Bill will begin his role as Interim the week of April 25, following final approval of Southeast Alabama Presbytery. His primary role will include leading our ministerial staff, preaching in conjunction with our other ministers, and helping to care for our congregation.
