Today, we welcome Rev. Dr. Jonathan (Jonny) Gibson to the Trinity pulpit. Dr. Gibson is Associate Professor of Old Testament at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. He holds a PhD in Hebrew Studies, from Girton College, Cambridge University. He is an ordained teaching elder in the International Presbyterian Church, UK, and previously served as associate minister at Cambridge Presbyterian Church in England. He was Lecturer in Biblical Theology in the Christian Heritage Apprenticeship Program in Cambridge from 2013–2015.



Dr. Gibson is a contributor to and co-editor (with David Gibson) of From Heaven He Came and Sought Her: Definite Atonement in Historical, Biblical, Theological, and Pastoral Perspective. He is

also the author of historical and biblical articles in *Themelios, Journal of Biblical Literature*, and *Tyndale Bulletin*, as well as "Obadiah" in the *NIV Proclamation Bible*. He authored *Be Thou My Vision: A Liturgy for Daily Worship*, and several children's books including *The Moon Is Always Round, The Acrostic of God*, and *The Acrostic of Jesus*.
