Today, we welcome Rev. Dr. Jonathan (Jonny) Gibson to the Trinity pulpit. Dr. Gibson is Associate Professor of Old Testament at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. He holds a PhD in Hebrew Studies, from Girton College, Cambridge University. He is an ordained teaching elder in the International Presbyterian Church, UK, and previously served as associate minister at Cambridge Presbyterian Church in England. He was Lecturer in Biblical Theology in the Christian Heritage Apprenticeship Program in Cambridge from 2013–2015.



Dr. Gibson is a contributor to and co-editor (with David Gibson) of From Heaven He Came and Sought Her: Definite

Atonement in Historical, Biblical, Theological, and Pastoral Perspective. He is also the author of historical and biblical articles in Themelios, Journal of Biblical Literature, and Tyndale Bulletin, as well as "Obadiah" in the NIV Proclamation Bible. He is the author of Be Thou My Vision: A Liturgy for Daily Worship; O Come, O Come, Emmanuel: A Liturgy for Daily Worship from Advent to Epiphany — the devotional Trinity Presbyterian Church is using to prepare our hearts during the 2023 Christmas season; and O Sacred Head Now Wounded: A Liturgy for Daily Worship from Pascha to Pentacost which will be available in early January 2024. He also authored several children's books, including The Moon Is Always Round, The Acrostic of God, and The Acrostic of Jesus.
