- Q: What is your only comfort in life and death?

- Q: How many things are necessary for you to know, that in this comfort you may live and die happily?
- A: Three things: First, the greatness of my sin and misery.

 Second, how I am redeemed from all my sins and misery.

 Third, how I am to be thankful to God for such redemption.
