THE ENDURING COMMUNITY V. A Model Prayer for the Church Today

Ephesians 1:15-23

The Apostle Paul's Example of Prayer

- 1. The possibility of prayer anytime or place Paul in prison, yet prays. Eph. 4:1
- 2. The place of prayer in apostolic ministry:
 - a. The great Apostle labors in prayer himself. "Strive together with me in your prayers to God on my behalf." Rom. 15:30
 - b. He commands the Church to pray. I Tim. 2:1
- 3. The prompting of prayer by truth:
 - a. Truth of theology "For this reason (v. 15)" points to truths contained in vv. 3-14
 - b. Truth of testimony "having heard of your faith and our love" v. 15.
- 4. The priority of thanksgiving in prayer: "do not cease giving thanks" v. 16
- 5. The perseverence required in prayer v. 16. "I do not cease...remembering you in my prayers."
- 6. Prayer for specific spiritual personal maturity is paramount. vv. 17b-19.

The Foundational Principle: The ground of ALL spiritual life and growth is Holy Spirit-given conviction of divine truth.

vv. 17-18 "may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him, ... that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened *so that you may know*...."

The Four Petitions for Knowledge:

- 1. We must know our God v. 17
- 2. We must know our hope v. 18
- 3. We must know our riches v. 18
- 4. We must know our power v. 19

The Assurance of Prayer's Fulfillment. - vv. 19b-23.

- 1. The Power at work within us. vv. 19b-20.
- 2. The Person above us and all things. vv. 21-23
