The Prayer of Confession – adapted from the Dutch Psalter, 1566

Eternal and merciful God and Father,
we humble ourselves before Your great Majesty,
for we have frequently and grievously sinned against You.
We acknowledge that if You were to enter into judgment against us,
we would deserve nothing but eternal death.
We are deeply conscious of the fact that we are conceived and born in sin,
and that all manner of evil desires against You and our neighbor fill our hearts.
We all, like sheep, have gone astray and each of us has turned to his own way.

We acknowledge our waywardness and are heartily sorry for all our sins.

We confess that we have nothing with which to repay our debt.

Therefore, we are not worthy to be called Your children.

Nevertheless, O Lord God and gracious Father, we know that You do not desire the death of the sinner, but rather that we should turn to You and live.

We know that Your mercy toward those who turn to You is infinite; and so we take courage to call upon You from the depths of our hearts, trusting in our Mediator Jesus Christ,

the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

Have compassion on us and forgive us all our sins for Christ's sake.

Wash us in the pure fountain of His blood,

so that we may become clean and white as snow.

Cover our nakedness with His righteousness, for the glory of Your name.

Free our understanding from all blindness,

and our hearts from all stubbornness and rebellion. Amen.


