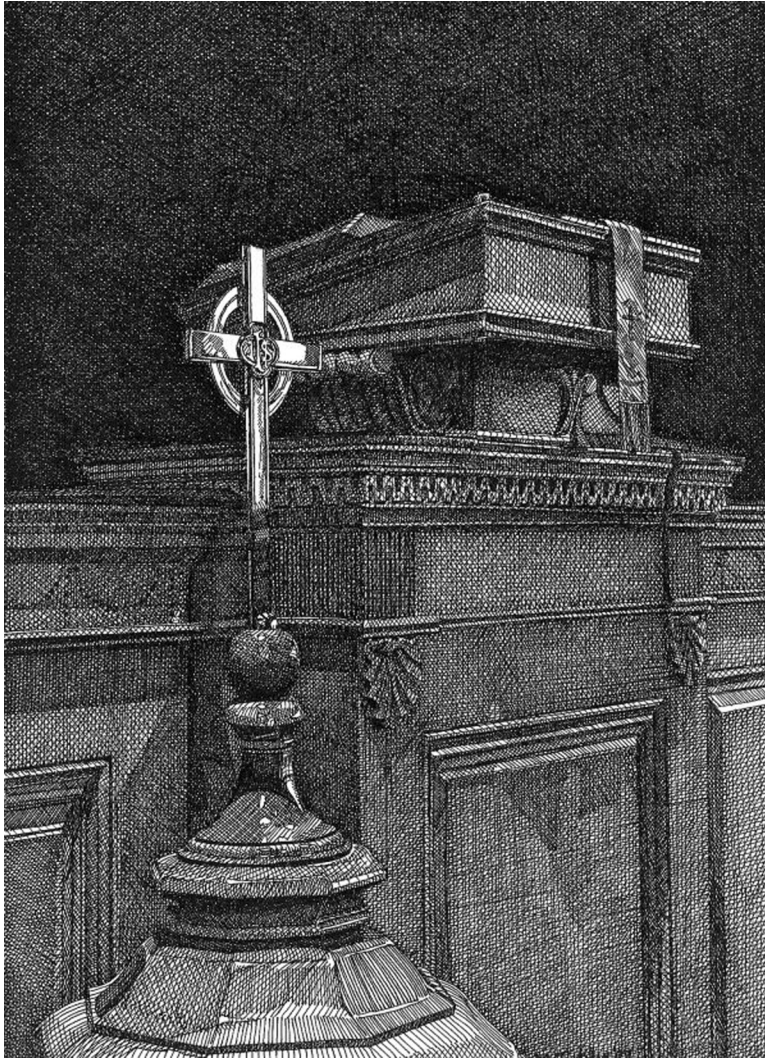

THE SILENT MEDITATION UPON ENTERING THE SANCTUARY

Q: Should infants, too, be baptized?

A: Yes. Infants as well as adults belong to God's covenant and congregation. Through Christ's blood the redemption from sin and the Holy Spirit, who works faith, are promised to them no less than to adults. Therefore, by baptism, the sign of the covenant, they should be incorporated into the Christian church and distinguished from the children of unbelievers. This was done in the Old Testament by circumcision, in place of which baptism was instituted in the New Testament.
