Where Do Our Missionaries Live and Work?

Bill and Carol were first called to be missionaries while working with Intervarsity Christian Fellowship, which is a college student ministry at Auburn University. During that time Bill went on a missions trip and became interested in doing medical missions work. He earned a degree in physical therapy from Auburn and then they served at a hospital in Kenya, Africa. Bill helped crippled children heal and learn to walk.

Bill will be working as a physical therapist again and Carol will teach people how to speak English. #358 "For All the Saints"

This is a memorial hymn because it remembers those early Christians who confessed their faith to the world, frequently in the face of persecution, and have gone on to be with Christ in heaven. The 3rd verse seems to be a prayer that we, too, would fight for the cause of Christ as the "saints of old" and also "win the crown of gold."

#645 "Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee"

We don't even know who wrote this hymn back in the 11th century, but it has survived for 1000 years! When you read the first verse, he seems to be saying that though just merely THINKING about Jesus is wonderful in itself, how wonderful it will be to see His face and be in His presence. Look at the 3rd verse where Jesus is referred to as HOPE and JOY, KIND to those who fall and GOOD to those who seek Him. Verse 4 points out how only those with a personal experience with Jesus can possibly understand the love Jesus has for His children





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
