Jeff and Heather along with their children are serving as missionaries in Costa Rica. Jeff was raised in a church family and became interested in missions when he went on missions trips as a teenager. Heather became a Christian because a grade school friend told her about Jesus. They met at Covenant College. After becoming a minister, Jeff served as Youth Pastor in Kansas, but then they went to the Philippines as missionaries for a year and then worked along the Mexico and Texas border for several years.

They have been in Costa Rica less than two years. Jeff trains several Costa Rican men to become pastors. He also meets with youth from five different churches. Gracie goes to an international school while Sam and Betsy are home schooled because there is not a good school for them to attend. They are looking for a better school solution for next year.
