


Dear Children,

Today, we will talk about the love a Daddy has for a Mommy ... a husband for his wife ... a groom for his bride. It's very, very important that a husband love his wife dearly, that he live with her with patience, that he honor her, and that he pray with and for her. He needs to prize her!

I am going to tell you a story I gave you three years ago in the children's bulletin, but I want you to have it again so that you can talk to your parents about it. It's a great story of a man who paid eight cows for his wife!! Listen ... read it ...

The story takes place on a primitive Pacific island where a man paid a dowry for his wife in cows. Two or three cows would buy you a decent wife; four or five cows would buy you a very nice wife. But Johnny Lingo had offered an unheard of EIGHT COWS for Sarita, a girl that everyone in the village (including her own family) knew was very plain looking. Everyone made fun of Johnny Lingo for paying so much for such a plain girl like Sarita.

But when the teller of the story finally sees Johnny Lingo's wife, she is stunned by her beauty! She inquires: Could this be the same woman? How is it that she is so – different?

Johnny replies: "Do you ever think what it must mean to a woman to know that her husband has settled on the lowest price for which she can be bought? And then later, when the women talk, they boast of what their husbands paid for them. One says, four cows, another maybe six. How does she feel, the woman who was for one or two? This could not happen to my Sarita."

Then you did this just to make your wife happy?

"I want Sarita to be happy, yes. But I wanted more than that. You say she is different. This is true. Many thing can change a woman. Things that happen inside, things that happen outside. But the things that matters most is not what she thinks about herself. In Kiniwata, Sarita believed she was worth nothing. Now she knows she is worth more than any other woman in the islands."

Then you wanted...

"I wanted to marry Sarita. I loved her and no other woman."


But... I was close to understanding.

## **Suggested Questions from the Morning Sermon**

- 1. Someone tell the story of "Johnny Lingo's Eight-Cow Wife." Discuss.
- 2. What is Jesus' standard of how much a husband should love his wife?
- 3. Can husbands love that much? Should they try? Whose help do they need?
- 4. The greatest example of a man loving His wife is Jesus' love for His Bride, the Church. When a man fails to love his wife that much, He has One Who forgives Him. Which, of course, is the gospel message: we fall short of God's glory; we sin; but there is One Who forgives us and gives to us His righteousness/ perfection. Discuss.
  - 5. In what ways can a husband live with his wife in an understanding way? Mom, share what your husband might do to love you in an understanding way. Dad, share with the family how you think you can do this.
    - 6. How can dad and mom get to know each other better?
      - 7. How can a husband HONOR his wife?
    - 8. Why should mom and dad pray together? In your home, do they? When?
  - 9. What is the purpose of the cross? What did Jesus do for us on the cross?

Wayne Curles is the father of Patrick Curles who is one of our ministers. Wayne has done many different jobs. First, he was a college professor. Later, after becoming a Christian, he became a pastor. Then, he began serving in Eastern Europe by teaching pastors and church leaders for the Biblical Education by Extension (BEE) Seminary.

He taught in several northern European countries, Ukraine, Western Russia, and Central Asia. In the last few years, he has taught in Myanmar and other Southeast Asian countries. Wayne lives in Birmingham, but travels there two or three times a year to teach in a seminary.

Over 400 pastors and students are enrolled in seminary classes in Myanmar, with new classes being formed each year. Training these church leaders is important so the church in this part of the world will grow and glorify God.
