Dear Children,

When I was your age, I thought there was no one stronger than my dad. And I would scream, and he would "fly" onto the bed ... barely missing me; then grab me and start tickling me!

But dads have lots of responsibility too. Their job as a dad is not easy. He must lead. He must set an example. He must love. He must provide, protect and punish. And he must do it all with patience.

Actually, it's an impossible job, but the Christian man is filled with the Holy Spirit. The Spirit will enable him, help him, guide him and grant him wisdom.

You should pray for your dads. You know as well as anyone how to pray for him, so you should pray for him everyday.



Family Promise serving in Montgomery

"Engaging people of faith to empower homeless families to return to stability"

This week's missions ministry also serves families who don't have a place to live, but it is different from last week's homeless ministry. This week's ministry is called Family Promise. We do this ministry to certain homeless families right here in Trinity Church and in our missions house next door. Usually, they can not afford their house or apartment because the parents lost their job, or were sick or had to pay for very expensive car repairs. Trinity shares our church facilities with 3 or 4 homeless families for one week every three months to help them while they recover from a difficult situation. We give them meals and a safe place to sleep in our building. Most of all, we encourage our guest families and show them Jesus' love because of the love He gives us. During the day the families go to school, work, or look for a job. It usually takes about 4 months for a family to recover and get back into their own home.

Trinity Church does this with 14 other churches in Montgomery. Perhaps you have helped your parents provide meals or even stay overnight in the missions house or the church when we hosted Family Promise. This is one of the easiest and most fun ministries we do because children can help their parents serve other people in Jesus' name.
