


# Just a word from Mr. Mac!

Dear Children,

We are starting a new series in the book of Romans this morning. What that means is that we will study this book in my sermons in Sunday morning worship for many months; maybe a little over a year.

Did you know one time we studied one book of the Bible (Matthew) for over FIVE years!! (I would not do that again! I'm not sure the congregation really wanted to be in ONE book that long!!) We will not do that with Romans, but Romans is a book one could study that long.

Romans has changed many people's lives – some of them famous; some sitting in our church. It is many people's favorite book of the Bible.

It can get deep, but for the most part, Paul was writing to people who were poor and uneducated. He simply felt so much love for grace and the way God had saved him, he wrote about it in this book to the church at Rome.


Paul had never met the people to whom he was writing. He longed to meet them. He speaks of wanting so much to come to Rome and meet them, pray with them, teach them, and encourage them. But he is actually in prison in Corinth while he is writing this letter.

You'll hear stories this morning about some of those famous people who were led to Jesus by this book of Romans: Augustine, Martin Luther, John Wesley, and others. But the most important question you and I must ask is: has God changed ME like He did Paul? Do I love Jesus? Do I love His grace and mercy? Do I realize what Jesus has done for me?

Also, today was the day we asked everyone to invite a friend. Were you able to invite a friend to church today? Do they go to church somewhere else or do they attend church at all? Thank you for trying to bring a friend. Inviting people shows how much you love our church, but more importantly, it shows how much you love Jesus.





# A Bible for the Rujak

Can you imagine how it might be if we didn't have a Bible? How could we learn about Jesus? How would your Sunday School teacher or Mr. Mac know what to teach each week about God? There are some people in our city who don't have a Bible, but Bibles are available if they wanted one. There are many countries in the world where there is no Bible because it hasn't been translated into their language. There are some people in the world who don't even have a written language.

We sometimes call the Bible The Word of Life because it tells us how to believe in Jesus so we will have eternal life with Him. During our missions conference this past week, we learned about a plan to provide a Bible in the language of 500,000 people known as the "Rujak". They live in South Asia. No one has ever told them about Jesus. We learned about three families who moved to where the Rujak people live so they can learn that language, and then translate the Bible into that language. Each of those families have children who go to school in their house, but their dads' work will be translating the Bible. It will take at least five years to do that.

### #295 "Crown Him with Many Crowns"


Isn't it interesting to imagine a king crowned with not one, but many crowns! Can you think how wonderful it would be if every one of us put a "crown" on Jesus by making him King in our own life? We sing of the "Lamb upon his throne", the "Lord of Love", the "Lord of peace", the "Lord of years".

Verse 4 has some mighty big words!! Do you know that "Potentate" means the most high and powerful of Kings (King of Kings)? The rolling spheres mean the planets in their orbits. And no matter what, praise of the almighty God will NOT fail, even if it looks like the world is winning.

### #455 "And Can It Be That I Should Gain"

This hymn is very poetic and beautiful. The writer speaks of the wonder and mystery of Christ's death for our sins. Verse 4 says "long my imprisoned spirit lay fast bound in sin and nature's night...I woke, the dungeon flamed with light; my chains fell off." This is a wonderful picture of how we are imprisoned by our sins, but Jesus' death and resurrection saved us and covered our sin with His light, releasing us from the chains of sin. We are now free in His salvation!

# Learning Together!

### ROMANS 1:1-7 ~ Paul, an apostle

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ, To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Paul was an apostle. Do you know what an apostle is? An apostle is a messenger who shares the Good News of Jesus Christ, sort of like a missionary. Paul was selected by Jesus to to spread the Gospel among the nations. He called himself "an apostle to the gentiles."

Are you a servant of Jesus Christ? Are you set apart? Have you received God's grace? Do you belong to Jesus Christ? You are loved by God and are called to be his saints! If you have not given your life to Christ, talk to your parents or your Sunday school teacher about how to do that. In the words of Paul, *Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ*.



This Lord's Day is "Come and See" Sunday.

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Pray for that person and pray that they will accept your invitation to come to church.
