





You are very different. The gardener gave ME the carrot. But you were giving yourself the horse."



Chaplains serve people outside the Church

God calls ministers to serve in many different ways. Most are like Mr. Mac and work at a specific church, preach from a pulpit each week and serve that congregation. Other ministers are called to be chaplains. They serve God outside a regular church like Trinity. Many chaplains serve the military while others are in hospitals and prisons or a police and fire department because people in all those places are not able to attend a regular church each week.

Military chaplains serve soldiers, sailors, airmen and marines where ever they are around the world. They normally lead worship services for military people in churches called chapels on military bases, but they also hold services outside, even where soldiers are preparing for combat. Chaplains remind people that God will be with those who trust in Him. Several Trinity members are chaplains. Lieutenant Colonel Wyllly Collins serves with the Alabama National Guard. Colonel Dan Oh serves in Virginia. Chaplain Tom Bridges serves in the Montgomery County Jail.

Learning Together!

The Lord's Prayer

Mr. Mac has been asking you and your family to recite the Lord's Prayer together during family worship. This is a prayer that Jesus taught the disciples. This is what our prayer life should be modeled after. Do you know it by heart? Do you understand it? Here is the King James Version, which we use in the PCA:

Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name.
Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil:
For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.

We use the NKJ version for the sake of tradition, but it might be easier to understand in a newer version of the Bible. Let's try ESV:

1. Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.
2. Your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
3. Give us this day our daily bread,
4. and forgive us our debts,
5. as we also have forgiven our debtors.
6. And lead us not into temptation,
7. but deliver us from evil.

1. We should always begin our prayers by honoring God's name and praising Him. "Hallowed" means holy. His name is the name above all names!
2. Next, you should ask for God's will to be done. God has a will, his plan and purpose, for each of our lives.
3. Once we have asked for His will, we can ask Him to provide for our needs. God promises to provide for our needs. He might not always give you what you want, but He will give you what you need.
4. Next, ask for forgiveness of sins. Confess any sins you have committed and ask God to forgive you.
5. We are called to forgive others as God has forgiven us.
6. Ask God to keep you away from temptations to sin.
7. Ask God to keep all evil and bad people and things away from you.

If you use these principles when you pray, your prayers will be pleasing and honoring to God. If you need to pray and can't think of what to pray, try praying the Lord's prayer.
