




What the Bible says about 'justification' is so important that it is like Atlas carrying the entire weight of the world and sky. If we stumble on 'justification', then the world will come crashing down.



Joe & Alice Parker Serving in North Carolina With Wycliffe/JAARS

Joe grew up in Montgomery. After graduating from Troy State University, he entered his family's heating and air conditioning business. Alice grew up in a military family that settled in Alabama.

They met on a missions trip in Mexico. God called them to serve in Australia to work with a church planting team. They returned to Montgomery and the family business for five years, and then did full-time missions in Mexico. Later, God called them to serve Him with Wycliffe Bible Translators at the Jungle Aviation and Radio Service Center (JAARS) in Waxhaw, NC, which is Wycliffe's technical and logistical support headquarters. Joe works in the Construction and Maintenance Department where he repairs air conditioning, heating and appliances for the Center, teaches orientation classes for people going to other parts of the world, serves as the department prayer coordinator, and on the JAARS Spiritual Vitality Committee. They are great examples of how God uses many different kinds of talent to take the gospel to other parts of the


#94 "How Firm a Foundation"

Learning Together!

Justification

What is justification? It is a pretty big word.

Dictionary.com says it is "Also called justification by faith. Theology. The act of God whereby humankind is made or accounted just, or **free from guilt or penalty of sin**."

So, it is an act of God that makes us free from guilt and sin. Not an act of ourselves. Justification is the process of God making us free of sin. How does this work?

Romans 4:7-8 (quoted in Romans from Psalm 32:1-2)

"Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered; blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

Abraham's faith was counted to him as righteousness. He was justified by faith. This is the same for us. If we believe in God and His Son, Jesus, our faith will be counted to us as righteousness, too.

Romans 4:24-25

It [righteousness] will be counted to us who believe in Him Who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, Who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

To be righteous means to be moral, honest, and virtuous. So, it is Jesus' death on the cross and our faith in Him that makes God look down and see us as "moral, honest, and virtuous," not anything we have done or haven't done.

This is the Good News of Christ! This is why we need to share this Good News with everyone! We were all slaves to sin and dead in our trespasses until Jesus Christ came and set us free through justification by faith.

Isaiah 44:22

I have blotted out your transgressions like a cloud and your sins like mist; return to Me, for I have redeemed you.

Micah 7:18-19

Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of His inheritance? He does not retain his anger forever, because He delights in steadfast love. He will again have compassion on us; He will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea.

Psalm 85:2

You forgave the iniquity of Your people; You covered all their sin. Selah

Acts 13:38-39

Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by Him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses.

Isaiah 43:25

I, I am He Who blots out your transgressions for My own sake, and I will not remember your sins.

Hebrews 8:12

For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more.

Psalm 103:12
