

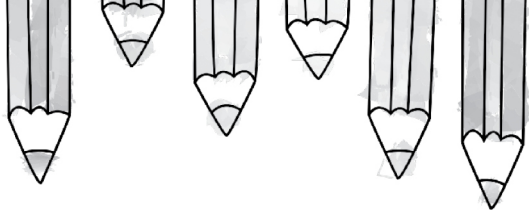

Sing patriotic songs together.

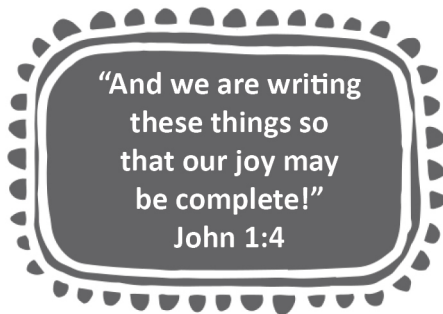
Call your grandparent(s) and thank them for all the things they have for you.

5. What does it mean to have a personal relationship with Jesus?
6. What is God like?
7. What is faith? Can you give examples from the Bible? See Hebrews 11.
8. How can I know God loves me? How can I have peace? Where does joy come from? How can I know grace in my life? All these questions were answered in Mr. Mac’s sermon – especially at the conclusion.



Mission to the World**

David and Erin were raised in Georgia. He came to faith in Jesus as a child. He went to Auburn and studied chemical engineering, but turned to missions after making several evangelistic trips to Eastern Europe. Erin came to faith in junior high school. She went to Duke University and earned degrees in Middle Eastern Studies and teaching English. She worked for Arab World Ministries in Europe and the Middle East where she met David.

After getting married, they served in Bulgaria, and then moved to Ukraine to help start churches. They teach English classes throughout the year as a way of reaching out to people and helping them learn about Jesus. In the summer, they have English camp and people come from churches in the United States to help teach English and lead Ukrainians to Jesus. Last year, Russian soldiers invaded part of their country. Their city is safe, but it created many fears because some of the Ukrainian citizens welcomed the Russians while others did not want them. Their children are Clara (19) and Josiah (17).
