



But three of our blessings are: PEACE WITH GOD


ACCESS TO HIS GRACE HOPE FOR HIS GLORY

Suggested Questions from the Morning Sermon

- 1. What is peace? What is the difference between peace WITH God and the peace OF God?
- 2. What does "access" mean? See Mr. Mac's letter in this issue. Mr. Mac also said the word really means, "an introduction" to grace. Can you explain this to your children? By faith in Jesus we are introduced to grace; we are given access to God; we become His friends.
- 3. Have fun sharing different stories of famous people you have met. Or, perhaps talk about who you'd most like to meet. Then consider: who would ever be able to introduce you to them?
- 4. For what do we hope? Talk about God's glory and heaven. And what is hope? In this passage it means confidence; surety; conviction. It's something that is certain.
- 5. Does God love you and want to spend time with you? We read Song of Solomon 2:10-14 at the end of the sermon before communion ... speaking to God's love for us and desire to be with us.



Marty Baas Serving This Week with a Mission to the World Medical Team in Gambia

Marty lives in Montgomery and is a member of Trinity Church. She was a missionary in Mexico for about 10 years where she taught in a Christian school. Now, she is normally with us for worship every Sunday, but several times a year she participates in a short-term missions trip. This week she is on a medical missions trip to the African country of Gambia.

Marty is not a doctor or nurse, but she likes to work with medical teams. She welcomes the patients when they first come to the clinic and asks why they came so the right doctor or nurse will see them. She also prays with the patients while they wait to see the doctor and helps them know more about Jesus so they can put their faith in Him. Sometime medical trips go to where a missionary is already working, but sometimes, they go where a regular long term missionary would not be allowed. Please pray for Marty.


#172 "Let Us Love and Sing and Wonder"

Lamb of God!" He is Jesus and He is worthy of our praise!
He has washed us clean and has freed us from sin!

#378 "Here, O My Lord, I See Thee Face to Face"

This is a perfect hymn for communion. Most of you have probably not ever taken communion, but I am sure you have seen it and heard about it. We eat bread and drink grape juice that symbolize Jesus' body and blood shed on the cross for our sins. Taking communion is a very intimate moment with Jesus. Verse 4 says "Mine is the sin, but Thine the righteousness; mine is the guilt, but Thine the cleansing blood." Communion is a reminder that Christ died for our sins and we do it in remembrance of Him!

Learning Together!

Song of Solomon 2:10-14

My beloved speaks and says to me: "Arise, my love, my beautiful one, and come away, for behold, the winter is past: the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth, the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land. The fig tree ripens its figs. and the vines are in blossom: they give forth fragrance. Arise, my love, my beautiful one, and come away. O my dove, in the clefts of the rock, in the crannies of the cliff, let me see your face, let me hear your voice, for your voice is sweet, and your face is lovely.

"My Beloved" in the first verse is referring to Jesus. Jesus is our beloved and we are His. The words that are underlined, "my love, my beautiful one," are referring to believers. They are referring to YOU. Imagine that Jesus is speaking these words directly to you. The title of this passage in the ESV is "The Bride adores her beloved." We, as Christians, are the bride of Christ. Verse 16 says "My beloved is mine, and I am His." It is kind of hard to understand, but Jesus is like a husband to us, as He takes care of us, and watches over us, and provides for us.

You will find this terminology throughout the Bible. For example, Isaiah 61:10 says:

I will greatly rejoice in the Lord; my soul shall exult in my God, for He has clothed me with the garments of salvation; He has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a **bridegroom** decks Himself like a priest with a beautiful headdress, and as a **bride** adorns herself with her jewels.

Jesus is the bridegroom; we are His bride. He covers us with a robe of righteousness and clothes us in garments of salvation.

Isn't this absolutely beautiful? He loves us!

Revelation 19 talks about the "Marriage Supper of the Lamb."

Once again, the Lamb is Jesus and the marriage is between believers and

Christ in heaven. Read the passage below:

"Hallelujah!

For the Lord our God

the Almighty reigns.

Let us rejoice and exult

and give Him the glory,

for the marriage of the Lamb has come,

and His Bride has made herself ready;

it was granted her to clothe herself

with fine linen, bright and pure"—

for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints.

You can also read Matthew 25 and "The Parable of the Ten Virgins," which warns us to be ready at all times for our bridegroom's return. Read this parable. How can we be ready for Christ's return?
