



Just a word from Mr. Mac!

Dear Children,

Wow! I have so much to tell you about today!!! I'm so excited!

First of all, tonight we get to hear stories about China from one of our missionaries who is a member of Trinity Church. William Stabler went to Trinity School where he played football, basketball and baseball; then William went to the University of Alabama. He's been serving as a missionary in China for a year, and he is home getting ready to go back to China for another year! He will speak tonight for a few minutes.

Speaking of Sunday evenings at Trinity Church ... I hope you like coming back to church on Sunday nights. Isn't it fun and peaceful! Your parents are enjoying a series on great things that happen to Christians, and you get to play games, learn the catechism (like I did when I was your age), and eat supper together!

This morning, I will be preaching on how much God loves us. Did you know that God loves you so much, He brings suffering into your life to make you a better person! Ha. That doesn't sound much like love, does it? It's like my saying to you, "I love you so much, I am going to make you feel pain." But that's not exactly how this works with God. He is saying, "I love you so much, I want you to be more like my Son; I want you to want heaven; I want you to have hope; I want you to be able to endure; I want you to have strong character and influence others; I want you to be able to handle all the pressures in this life ... sooooo, I'll bring things into your life that make you able to do that!"

God DOES love us so much! Have you ever thought if someone asked you, "Why do I have so much pain in my life," you could answer, "Because God loves you."


One more thing about suffering and God's love that ties in with China and William Stabler – a story I plan to tell the church this morning. You can read this with your mom and dad and talk about it:

The church in China grew really large during terrible suffering under the Communists. An American student was going to Hong Kong to study the Chinese church. Before he left the United States, a friend had asked him, "If God loves the Chinese church so much, why did he allow so much suffering to come upon it?" The student had no answer.

But after he had traveled to China and had talked in depth with many Chinese Christians, he decided to go back to America and ask his friend this question: "If God loves the American church so much, why hasn't He allowed us to suffer like the church in China?"

- 2. What makes Christians different from others in the world? Mr. Mac said Christians are strange or weird. Why would he say that? Why does the world think that about us Christians? Why should they think that about us?

- 4. How does God show us He loves us? Did anyone say, by suffering? If so, in what ways can we know God loves us when we suffer?
- 5. Many Scriptures are provided in the sermon outline under "Introduction" that address how Christians respond to suffering.
- 6. What does this mean: "God is FOR me?" What proof is their Jesus' heavenly body on this very day that God loves me?



Music and Hymns


#94 "How Firm a Foundation"
