




Just a word from Mr. Mac!

Dear Children,

I'm excited about this Lord's Day! I like when we have a fifth Lord's Day in a month. And today we have new members joining ~ that's three weeks in a row, which is very encouraging. And I am excited because I get to see YOU!

I've started praying for you and your new school year beginning. I know you probably don't want to think about that just yet, but I wanted you to know that you were on my mind and heart. I try to think about where you are, what you are doing, how you are spending your time from swimming to playing to reading.

I am also excited about this morning's passage for the sermon because the topic is something I really need personally. I need to hear about ASSURANCE.

Do you know what assurance is? Assurance is confidence; it is being certain about something; it is like a promise or a guarantee.

Some examples of "everyday assurances" might be: (1) you can be assured or confident or certain that school will start back in a couple of weeks; (2) you can be assured or confident or certain that we WILL have church this morning; (3) you can be assured or confident or certain that you will get a birthday present on your birthday.

But you know what? School may not start back; something may happen, and we don't have church today; or, it might just happen you don't get a birthday present on your birthday.


BUT GOD TALKS ABOUT ASSURANCE OF SALVATION!! OR ASSURANCE OF HEAVEN!! OR ASSURANCE THAT ONE DAY YOU WILL BE WITH HIM FOREVER!! AND THAT HE IS GOING TO PROTECT YOU ON THAT DAY JESUS COMES BACK TO TAKE YOU TO HEAVEN!!

And THAT is CERTAIN. There is no possible way it can't happen. And if you have a personal relationship with Jesus in which you know He lived for you, died for you, was resurrected from the dead for you, and now lives in heaven at His Father's right hand praying for you – then you can be assured that these will be true for you.

I want you to have that assurance. The Apostle Paul wanted you to have that assurance too. That's why he wrote Romans 5:9-11. And that tells me, the Holy Spirit wants you to have that assurance as well.



#38 "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise"



Learning Together!

Assurance of Salvation

What is assurance of salvation? It is something many people really, really struggle with. It is REALLY KNOWING that you have been saved by God's grace through His son Jesus Christ and that you WILL go to heaven and spend all eternity in His presence when you die. Do you have that assurance? Do you know how to get it?

Let's begin by reading the passage of scripture Mr. Mac preached on today:

Since, therefore, we have now been justified by His blood, much more shall we be saved by Him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by His life. More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. ~ Romans 5:9-11

This passage makes it clear that we have been "reconciled" to God. That is kind of a big word. Do you know what "reconciliation" means? Let me give you an example. If you and your friend had a fight and you stopped talking to each other for a few days, but then your friend came and apologized and you accepted their apology and began being friends again, you could say that you have reconciled your friendship. One of the definitions on dictionary.com is "to win over to friendliness." So, if you read Romans 5 verse 10 you can read it as "for if while we were enemies we [won God over to friendliness] by the death of His son." Jesus' death has made us a friend of God. God is your friend! He will save you! He will not let you perish! He will never leave you or foresake you!

Sometimes the enemy will try to get into your mind and make you think about all of the bad things you've done and cause you to think "I am not good enough, God will never accept me, I am doomed and there is nothing I can do about it." That simply is not true! Jesus has already done the work

and you simply need to trust in Him and REST in His salvation. Be ASSURED that he cares for you. If we still had to live being burdened by the law and whether or not we could live up to it, why did Jesus have to die? He died to remove us from this burden. Jesus says:

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

Matthew 11:28-30

Rest in that. If you ever feel yourself struggling and putting yourself down and questioning and doubting God, remind yourself of this verse. Jesus says that He wants to give you rest. He is gentle. His burden is light. Stop wrestling and simply come to Him and give your worries to Him.

Read the following verses and talk about them as a family:

Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made Him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning His Son. And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in His Son.

1 John 5:10-11

Do not gloat over me, my enemy!
Though I have fallen, I will rise.
Though I sit in darkness,
the Lord will be my light.
9 Because I have sinned against him,
I will bear the Lord's wrath,
until he pleads my case
and upholds my cause.
He will bring me out into the light;
I will see his righteousness.
Micah 7:8-9
