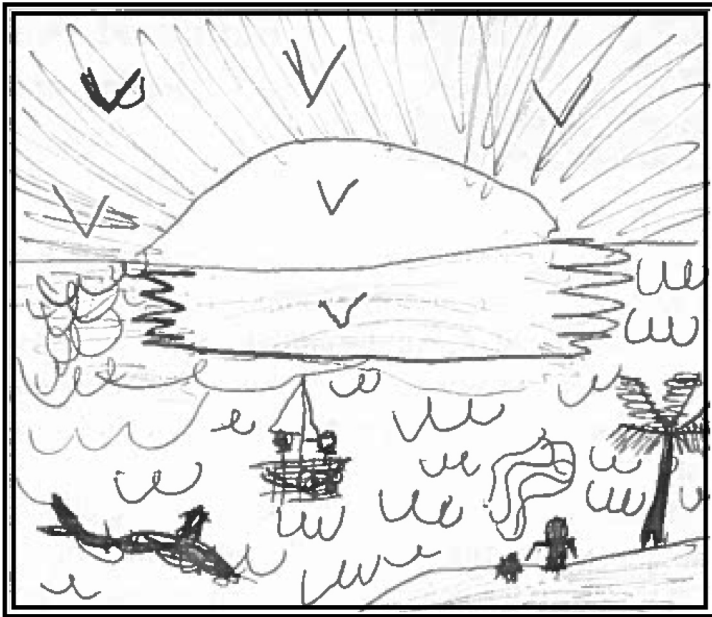


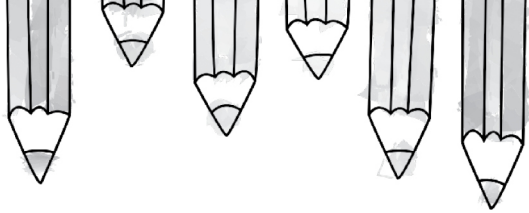

I am not sure when all of your schools or home-school started back, but I am assuming most of you are started back last week.

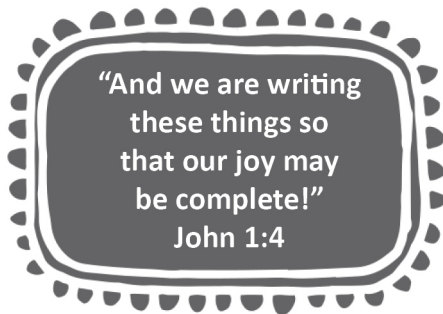
I would love to remind you of a few things:

Suggested Questions from the Morning Sermon

1. What is sin? (Look at answer in Children’s Catechism.)
2. What do you do when you sin? Do you confess it immediately? Do you confess it at night as you go to bed? Do you feel bad? Do you find in God a loving Father Who forgives you?
3. Because Adam sinned, we all are sinners and do continue to sin. Discuss.
4. Paul reminds us: God’s grace is greater than our sin. Discuss.
5. Knowing we are born in sin with a sin nature puts a lot into perspective. See outline to Mr. Mac’s sermon for a list of things the doctrine of original sin can teach us. This would be a great discussion from giving me humility to missions.
6. What did Jesus do for me on this earth besides die for me?
7. Describe God’s grace.
8. Christians are “in Christ.” Non-Christians are “in Adam.” Discuss. {Help: Christians have been taken out of Adam; out of the old man; saved from sin; forgiven – Christians are now by grace IN Christ.}



Adelaide, Schaeffer, Leo & Alexander Illman in **Cambridge, England**

Adelaide, Schaeffer, Leo and Alexander Illman are our missionary children for this week. They are visiting Trinity Church this week, although they live in Cambridge, England with their parents, David and Sarah, who serve the Lord with a ministry in that city. They are members of our church even though they live far away. Addie will be going into 5th grade, Schaeffer will go to 3rd grade, and Leo will start Kindergarten. The public schools don't talk about God in England so they walk to a Christian school near their house. They worship at Cambridge Presbyterian Church. It is much smaller than Trinity Church with about 100 people in the worship service each Sunday. Adelaide and Schaeffer like to read but they also play with many of the same toys you have. A missions team from Trinity visited them last year. The team took Tootsie Roll Pops and other treats because they can't buy those in England. Will you welcome them when they come to Sunday School?

#181 "We Come, O Christ, to You"

This hymn is structured around John 14:6 where Jesus says "I am the way and the truth and the life." This hymn proclaims that Jesus is the Son of God, the Way to God, the living Truth, the true Life, and Savior and King! Jesus is indeed all of those things and verse 4 says to know Him "is to live the more abundant life the world can never give." Jesus is the only way to peace and eternal life. Follow Him, come to Him and He will show you the way, the truth, and how to truly live!

#460 "Amazing Grace!"

Amazing Grace is probably the most recognizable hymn to most Christians. The simple words of this old favorite were written in 1779 by John Newton while living in England. Since his early life was filled with sin, this hymn is thought to have been his own testimony of his conversion and life as a Christian. The melody is an Early American tune of unknown origin. This hymn is of great comfort to the sinner saved by grace! If you believe in Jesus and make Him Lord of your life, he will also forgive you of your sins!
