




Just a word from Mr. Mike!

My dear young friends,

I want to tell you a true story about a young man who lived a long time ago.

Once upon a time, in a land far, far away, there lived a young man named Augustine. One day, he and a group of his friends climbed into a neighbor's field at night. In that field, there was a pear tree that was covered in pears. Augustine and his friends wanted to steal the pears. So, they shook the tree, causing many pears to fall on the ground. Then, they ran off with as many pears as they could carry. Some of the pears they ate, but most of the pears were thrown to some pigs. Now, why did Augustine and his friends steal the pears?

Was it because the pears were so beautiful? No.

Was it because Augustine & his friends were hungry? No.

Was it because Augustine had friends who were hungry & didn't have anything to eat? No.

Was it because Augustine & his friends wanted to be approved or admired by others? That is part of the reason. But it does not explain why approval or admiration would be given for doing something wrong. Why should stealing be worthy of praise?


Finally, Augustine tells us the real reason. He said that he stole the pears so he could steal! It was not the pears that he enjoyed; rather, it was the stealing that he enjoyed!

Wow!

This story is a picture of the passage for the morning sermon. God tells us "You shall not steal." But, sadly, sin in our hearts will take what God has told us ("You shall not steal") and use it for evil, that is, making us want to steal. That is sin's sad use of God's good commandment.

Wow! We certainly need the Lord Jesus Christ and all that He did. He always kept every word that God said. He never stole anything. He never broke any of God's commands. Rather, He always enjoyed obeying His heavenly Father.



Nancy and Jay Matsinger serving with Mission to the World in Prague, Czech Republic

Jay and Nancy met while college students. He served in the Army for 3 years while Nancy completed nurse training, and then Jay taught high school, but realized that God was calling him to become a pastor. After completing seminary, they went to France to tell people about Jesus and help start and strengthen churches.

Several years ago they began praying about another place where God would like them to work. They decided to move to Czech Republic where their son James serves as a missionary because there are more people in that country who don't believe in God than any other European country. Their plans were interrupted when Nancy became very sick and they returned to the United States for two years while she received medical care. Now, Nancy is regaining her health and they plan to go to Prague, which is the capital city in Czech Republic. They will work with a Presbyterian church and tell people about Jesus in English, French and the Czech language.


#642 "Be Thou My Vision"
