


Dear Children,

I grew up in South Georgia in town very much like Montgomery. My grandparents lived on a farm nearby and I spent much of my childhood on that farm. They died a number of years ago, but my family still owns the farm.


I love that farm. I want the farm to be beautiful, the fields to be neat, the trees to be tall and beautiful, and the house and barns to be perfect. But it needs some work for it to become the farm that I want it to be. When I have time, I will sometimes go to that farm and work on making it into the farm that I see in my mind and what I want it to be. This involves taking away all that does not belong (like weeds, rocks, old material, etc.) and putting in what I want to be there (beautiful trees, bushes, etc.).

I am telling you this because God is doing the same thing in our lives. God has a vision for what He wants us to be as men and women, boys and girls. And he is like a farmer or gardener who comes into our lives and begins the process of making us into a beautiful person free from all the things that hold us back. Sometimes that involves taking things away (sin) and sometimes it involves putting things in (righteousness, freedom, and healing). But the important thing to remember is that He is there, working in your life. He knows just what areas need some attention. He is a good, wise, and skilled gardener. He knows when there are weeds that need to be removed and he knows where a new planting is required as well.

Today's sermon is about how we can cooperate with the Gardener in our lives, God, so that He can do all His holy work in us.

Invite Him to do that. Just say, "Lord, I give you my life. Make me into what You want me to be. Thank you for Jesus. Amen."



Mary Fran Morris Serving with Mission to the World Medical In Dominican Republic and El Salvador

Mary Fran was raised in Montgomery and attended Trinity Church with her family since she was a baby. She has known and loved Jesus for as long as she can remember. Several people in her extended family were doctors or nurses, but she became interested in nursing because one of her brothers was very sick and had many special medical needs.

She studied nursing at college and became a pediatric nurse because she loves children and wants to bring healing to them. She works at Children's Healthcare in Atlanta, and also travels on medical missions trips to other countries that don't have good health care. She liked medical trips so much that she felt God was calling her to lead trips. This week she is co-leading a medical missions trip to Dominican Republic. In October, she will lead another medical team to El Salvador. Both countries are very poor and the many people are not able to see doctors when they are sick. Each team has several doctors, a dentist, a pharmacist, several nurses and other non-medical people who talk with and encourage the patients to know and trust Jesus.

#345 "Glorious Things of Thee are Spoken"


The special city of God referred to as Zion represents

Infant Baptism

This morning there were 3 babies baptized. Have you ever wondered why we baptize babies?

The following is an excerpt from a book we give to all parents who are having their children baptized:

"The Bible teaches that the sign of salvation is to be applied to the children of believing parents. In the Old Testament, circumcision was the sign. In the New Testament, baptism is the sign. The baptism of our children symbolizes the reality that they are set apart in the sight of God. In this baptism, parents covenant to raise their children by the direction of their Lord. Such a baptism calls a child from his earliest days to confess Christ as his Savior.

It is God who initiated, drew the terms of, and seals His covenant with His people. He graciously binds Himself to the promises of His Word. And He calls His children and His children's children to keep His covenant and know His blessing from generation to generation."
