


I know lots of people who have their favorite verse. Many people share those with me as their minister, and it helps me to know that person better. It also encourages me in my own walk with Jesus.



Trinity's Athens Missions Trip Team Serving With the Presbyterian Church in Greece

This week's missionaries are normally here in church with us every Sunday. They are Allen & Susan Clark, Elizabeth Bush, Tom Danielson, Melissa Gulley, Julia Pendley, Rob Pendley, and Clay & Jayme Teague.

They are on a missions trip this week in Athens, Greece working with a Greek Presbyterian Church and the Greek Bible College. Trinity has a partnership with these Greek Christians. Our team will visit their church on Sunday, and work with several of their ministries to refugees during the week. Greece has had thousands of people come to their country from Africa and the Middle East because of wars and poor economic conditions that caused them to seek a better life.

The team asks you to pray for: safety and protection; opportunities to share the gospel and the grace to do so; encouragement to the Greek Christians and the refugees; and for the Holy Spirit to teach the team members the lessons God wants them to learn. Will you pray for them?

#647 "How Sweet the Name of Jesus Sounds"


In Jesus' time, His name was very common. In Hebrew it would be "Yeshua," which would translate to Joshua in English.

Although His name was common, Jesus was everything BUT common. To us, His name represents salvation, freedom, hope, love, grace, mercy and so many more things! When we hear His name, we should be comforted by the fact that He loves us, He chose us, He forgives us no matter what we do, and He has gone to prepare a place for us so that we can live with Him forever!

#455 "And Can it Be that I Should Gain"

This hymn is very poetic and beautiful. The writer speaks of the wonder and mystery of Christ's death for our sins. Verse 4 says "long my imprisoned spirit lay fast bound in sin and nature's night...I woke, the dungeon flamed with light; my chains fell off." This is a wonderful picture of how we are imprisoned by our sins, but Jesus' death and resurrection saved us and covered our sin with His light, releasing us from the chains of sin. We are now free in His salvation!

Suggested Questions from the Morning Sermon

• Read Mr. Mac's letter in this issue of the Children's

Bulletin; discuss favorite verses in the Bible.

- What kinds of things did Mr. Mac say in his sermon that makes Romans 8 so special?
- What is condemnation? How would you describe it in your own words? The Christian need never fear condemnation! Why?
- What reaction might someone have if they see the depth of their sin and then are told that there is no condemnation? (tears of joy; worship; singing; praise)
- Can you try to explain the good parts of God's law (a wonderful God; teaches us about God; it shows us the very things that please God)? Can you explain why the law is a "relentless tyrant" (it demands perfection; it condemns because I break God's law everyday)? Think about this: the law says, "do this and live;" the gospel says, "you live, so do this." With the smallest of children you can teach them that God has a law that is good, and because He loves us so much, we want to please Him.
- Mr. Mac quoted another minister saying, If you reached into your pockets right now, you'd find the nails that were driven into his hands and feet of our blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Discuss.
