

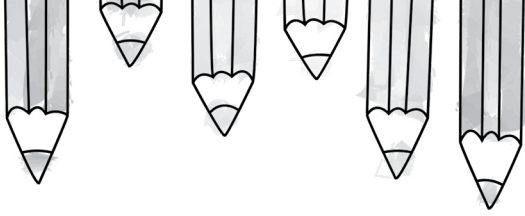

Just a word from Mr. Mike

My dear young friends,

This Sunday morning I want to preach on Genesis 15:1-6. It is a story of how God supported Abraham, when Abraham's faith was a bit shaky. God provided some 'crutches' so he could walk.

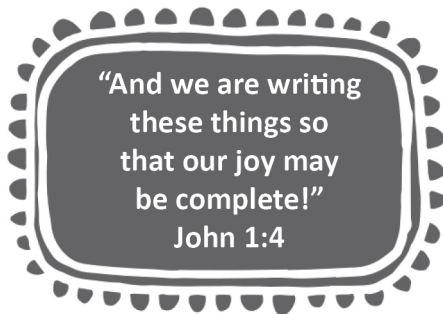
The plan is for me to tell a few stories. There is a story about a young boy named Luigi and another about a football player who broke his leg. Here is the story that I want to tell at the very beginning of the sermon:

A long time ago, John Tyler was the 1st vice-president of the United States to become president without an election. It happened this way. President William Henry Harrison died while in office. So that meant that the vice-president (John Tyler) would become president. The problem was this: President Harrison died so quickly that the vice-president did not get a pay check for being vice-president. That meant that John Tyler did not have enough money to pay for his trip to Washington D. C. and attend his own installation as president! Friends had to give him money, so he could travel to Washington D. C. and become president.

The point of the story is this: sometimes you can have a great privilege and yet have problems with that privilege. Abraham had a great privilege, but had problems with that privilege. That is the reason why God came and gave him some 'crutches' to help him walk with the privilege.



John and Cathy met while they were college students. After they were married, John went to seminary to become a minister. Later, they decided to become missionaries during a missions conference at their church. They have been starting churches in Chile since 1986.

You may not be able to tell this from the picture, but John is blind and has been so all of his life. That is why he has a service dog named Bertha. She helps him get around and even travel alone to the United States without any other family.

John's blindness helps him understand the needs of others who are blind or have physical disabilities that prevent them from doing things most people do. Because of this, his church makes a special effort to minister to people with disabilities as well as to their families.

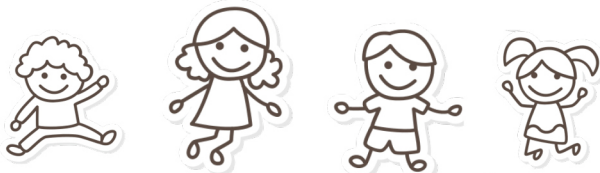
