


Dear Children,

In fact, there is no way to even compare your suffering here on this earth with the glory you will experience in heaven!!! It's too great and too wonderful!!!





Music and Hymns


#208 "O Come, All Ye Faithful"

This hymn tells the story of the shepherds coming to see Jesus. An angel appeared to the shepherds and told them that Jesus had been born. Then a large group of angels sang "Glory to God in the highest." The shepherds went to "adore Him" and they went and told everyone about what they had seen! #196 "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus"

This is a hymn about the joy and expectation of Jesus' birth and the joy and expectation of His second coming! Verse 4 says "Born thy people to deliver, born a child and yet a king, born to reign in us forever, now Thy gracious kingdom bring." Jesus' birth was prophesied hundreds of years before he was born. The Jews were anticipating a Messiah to be born of a virgin and that is exactly what happened. Now, 2000 years after His death, we await His second coming where we will get to see Him face to face. Learning Together!

Do you know what "Advent" means? Advent means "coming" in Latin and it is a time of preparation for Christmas, when Christ came to earth.

Advent begins four Lord's Days before Christmas.

Today is the first Lord's Day of Advent.

We use something called an Advent wreath on each of these Lord's Days and it contains 5 candles. Each candle has a meaning or significance.

Here are the different meanings of each of the candles:

The First Sunday of Advent ~ The Prophets' Candle, the first purple candle, which represents Christ's royalty and the sinner's repentance, is lighted. The coming of Christ was indeed foretold by the prophets of the Old Testament hundreds of years before the Incarnation of Christ.

The Second Sunday of Advent ~ The Bethlehem Candle, the second candle, is lighted pointing to the Messiah being born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem as foretold by the prophet, Micah.

The Third Sunday of Advent ~ The Shepherds' Candle, the third candle, is lighted to remind us that the birth of the Messiah was announced to humble shepherds, and that we, straying sheep, must go to Him, believe in Him and tell to others the Good News of salvation.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent ~ The Angels' Candle, lighted as the Festival of the Incarnation nears, reminds us of the angelic announcement and calls us to focus on Christ's finished work on the cross and to anticipate His second coming.

Christmas Eve ~ The Christ Candle, the white one in the center of the wreath, proclaims the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, Who gives the Light of Salvation to those who walked in sin's darkness. It is lighted on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Watch each Lord's Day for these candles and try to remember the special meaning of each one as we near Christmas Day.
