

Dear Children,

What about climbed a mountain? How high?

Do you know what the top of a mountain is called? THE SUMMIT.

When you reach the summit, you have reached the highest point, or the top.

Well, Romans 8 is like climbing a mountain. We started with realizing that God does not count our sin against us because He has declared us to be without guilt and sin before Him. And we talked a lot about being adopted into His family. And how the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness in prayer. And how the Holy Spirit prays for us. And how everything works together for our good. And how God has always loved us, and one day He promises to take us to heaven to be with Him. And then came a series of questions: could anything separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus?

And THAT is the SUMMIT of Romans 8!! Exactly what we are studying today – the end of Romans 8, and some of THE most wonderful things we could ever hear!!!


- 1. YOU WILL NEVER EVER BE SEPARATED FROM GOD'S LOVE!

A Guide to Family Worship January 8-13, 2017

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

#1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family. Try really hard to make the same time every day. #2 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect. #3 Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional. #4 Sing a song or two together. #5 #6 Take prayer requests. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray #7 for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for. #8 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/ #9 or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/ hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day. #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26 The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



Meet Our Missionaries!



For You created my inmost being, You knit me together in my mother's womb. -Psalm 139:13

This week we will be talking about the sanctity of human life. Sanctity means sacred or holy. We normally describe God as holy and we worship Him because of that. People are not holy like God, but the Bible teaches us to treat every person as very special and worthy of respect because God created every human being in His image.

Each person is different and unique because of their eyes, skin color, foot size, finger prints, personality and many other things, but everyone has the life that God created in them. No animal is described that way in the Bible. Psalm 139 says we are fearfully and wonderfully made by God and that He knows everything about each of us.

Because God gives each person life, He wants us to treat everyone with the same respect no matter how young or old they are or what color their skin is. The Bible tells us to take extra special care of those who cannot take care of themselves like babies, orphans, and elderly people. We should do that every day, but we reserve this special day in January to remind us to always do that.

#498 "Jesus! What a Friend for Sinners!"

Jesus is the perfect friend! He is always there to listen when you need someone to talk to, He loves you no matter what, He doesn't judge you or think less of you, and He is always willing to help! Verse 1 says "...friends may fail me, foes assail me, He, my Savior, makes me whole." Sometimes earthly friends can really hurt us. Unfortunately, friends come and go, but Jesus will never leave us and will never hurt us. Don't rely on your friends to make you happy, rely on Jesus and make Him your best friend! "Hallelujah! what a Savior! Hallelujah! what a friend!....He is with me to the end."

#455 "And Can it Be that I Should Gain"

This hymn is very poetic and beautiful. The writer speaks of the wonder and mystery of Christ's death for our sins. Verse 4 says "long my imprisoned spirit lay fast bound in sin and nature's night...I woke, the dungeon flamed with light; my chains fell off." This is a wonderful picture of how we are imprisoned by our sins, but Jesus' death and resurrection saved us and covered our sin with His light, releasing us from the chains of sin.

We are now free in His salvation!
