

Dear Children,

Today is Palm Sunday: the day we celebrate the courage of our Lord as He set His face toward Jerusalem knowing full-well He was going there to die for you and me.

It is the day of His Triumphal Entry!

And though the people then did not understand His Kingship (they wanted to make Him King then and hoped He would destroy all their enemies), we are blessed to understand that His Kingship is indeed over all, He was going to that place to destroy death, our greatest enemy.

We are thankful for His great courage. We are thankful for His great humility ~ His riding in on the young donkey. We are thankful for all He would endure for us in the next 5-6 days: the pain, the heartache, the beatings, the agony, the cross.

This week on Maundy Thursday, we will remember the Last Supper, the Upper Room, the Garden of Gethsemane, the betrayal, and the trial leading up to the crucifixion.


On Friday night we remember His death at our Tenebrae Service. All is dark and lonely and quiet and reverent.



Meet Moore & Ruth Serving in Asia PLEASE DO NOT POST ON INTERNET

This week's missionaries only go by first names just like we did with last week's. We don't identify them by their real names to protect them. They go by Moore and Ruth because they like those names. They live in a very secular Asian country where most people don't know about Jesus. The government is fearful of any organization that threatens their control of the people so they try to regulate or prevent any group that could undermine their authority. They do not welcome Christians even though Christians are not trying to take over their government. Sometimes, they put Christians and especially pastors in jail or even try to kill them.

Moore and Ruth are from that country, but they have lived in America while he learns to teach pastors about how to lead churches. The Christians in their churches worship God in secret to protect themselves and their families.

#235 "All Glory, Laud, and Honor"

We sing this every Palm Sunday because it mentions the children crying out "hosanna" as they waved their palms at His passing through the gates of Jerusalem on a donkey. Hosanna can be translated as "please save" or "save now." Did you know the word "laud" means "praise"? Zechariah prophesied about Jesus riding on a donkey in Zechariah 9:9 which states: "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is He, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

#469"How Sweet and Awesome is the Place"

Written by Isaac Watts, this one dates back to the year 1707.
