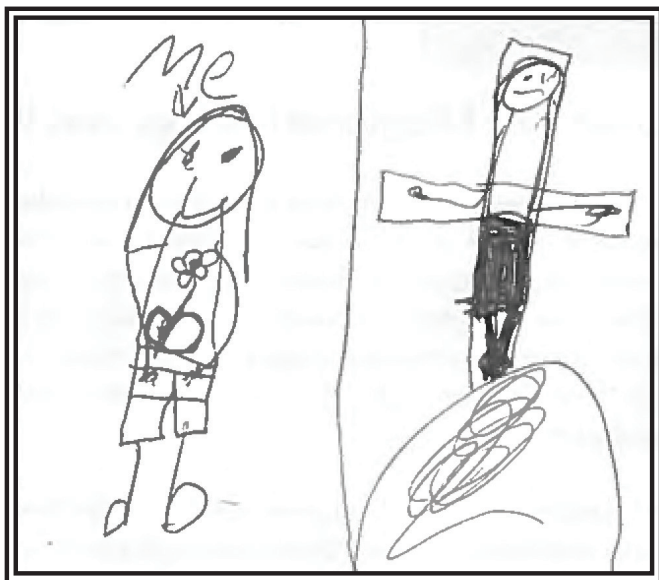


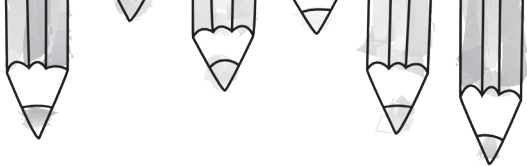

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Have you ever thought about why we have stop signs? Or speed limits? Or rules about not stealing or breaking into someone's home or car?

Do you have rules at home? Can you yell and shout whenever you want to? Can you talk back to your mother and not be punished?

What about at school: can you cheat or talk back to your teacher or yell at a friend or steal someone's lunch?

Of course not, because we have rules. It makes things safer, nicer, and better for everyone. In the same way, we have a government who enforces laws; policemen are called "law enforcement officers," and we are thankful for them. (In fact, when you see a policeman or fireman, you should say to them: Thank you for what you do. The same is true for our military: Thank you for serving our country. Because they keep us safe.)

Well, this morning, in our passage, the Apostle Paul makes it very clear how we should respect our leaders, honor them, and pay taxes – in other words, pay them for what they do for us. And we should be praying for our leaders, too.

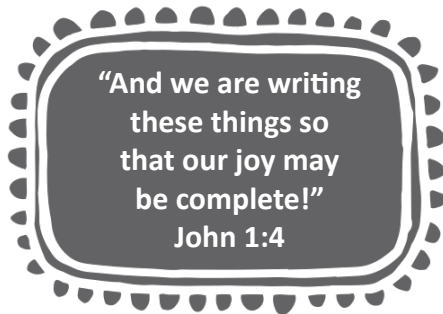
Maybe you can talk to your mom and dad about the Christian's role in our communities.

**THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!!
10 EASY STEPS**

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2** Try really hard to make the same time every day.

- #4** Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5** Sing a song or two together.
- #6** Take prayer requests.

- #8** Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9** Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26
The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



Unreached People Groups

Will you pray for people who live in places where no one has heard about Jesus?

Can you imagine living in a place with no churches, and where no one knows about Jesus? Many people around the world live in cities and villages where there are no Christians and no one to tell them that Jesus came to die and save them from their sins.

Many people in Montgomery don't know about Jesus, but there are churches like Trinity and Christians like us to tell them about Him. But, nearly 40 percent of all the people in the world live in places where there is no one to tell them about Jesus. They live in what are called Unreached People Groups. They have their own language and culture that separates them from other people.

Jesus told us to take the gospel to every nation, tribe and language. That job is not finished yet. Your family can learn more about people and places that have not heard about Jesus from the Joshua Project website or from the Operation World website. You can use those to pray for more people to learn about and trust Jesus.

#76 "Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven"

This hymn points out some of the many wonderful things we receive when we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior: ransom, healing, restoration, forgiveness, grace, favor, rescue, faithfulness, and mercy! Praise Him, "the everlasting King," "the High Eternal One," "the God of Grace." The Lord created you and He loves you. Praise Him for all he does!

#646 "Jesus, Thou Joy of Loving Hearts"

Verse 4 of this hymn really describes the gist of most of our prayers: "make all our moments calm and bright; chase the dark night of sin away, shed o'er the world Thy holy light." We want God to make our lives calm, happy, and free of sin. This is what Jesus offers us through salvation by believing in Him. Things might not always be perfect here on earth, but God hears our prayers and He promises that if we believe in His son, Jesus Christ, we will have eternal peace and rest with Him! Isn't that wonderful?
