

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER! 10 EASY STEPS

- 1. Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.

- 4. Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- 5. Sing a song or two together.
- 6. Take prayer requests.
- 7. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- 8. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- 9. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- 10. Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26



Meet Wayne and Ann Curles

Serving Asia With Church Resourcing Ministries

Where do our missionaries live and work?

Wayne Curles is the father of Patrick Curles who is one of our Trinity Church ministers. Wayne has done many different jobs. After college, he was an officer in the Navy, then a college professor and then went to seminary, became a minister and pastored a church. In 1988, he began serving in Eastern Europe by teaching pastors and church leaders for the Biblical Education by Extension (BEE) Seminary.

He taught in Ukraine, Western Russia, and Central Asia. In the last few years, he has taught in two Asian countries. Wayne and his wife Ann live in Birmingham, but he travels to Asia several times each year for two or three weeks. He teaches ministers and other people who are not able to go to a regular seminary as our pastors do. Over 400 students are enrolled in these Asian seminary classes. New classes start each year.

In Wayne's classes, the men learn more about the Bible so they can preach to their churches. Training these church leaders is important so the church in that part of the world will grow and glorify God in the ways they serve Him.

#252 "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross"

Do you ever stop to take a real close look at the cross and what it meant for Jesus to have to die on that terrible instrument of torture for your very own sins? Many people don't like to think about the price Christ had to pay because those thoughts are just too painful. We might not be murderers or thieves, but we all have pride in our hearts. "Sorrow and love flow mingled down" means that as he was dying for us, he had the mixed emotions of love and sorrow at the same time. In the 4th verse, we see where Isaac Watts, the hymn writer, concludes that "love so amazing and divine demands our soul, our life, OUR ALL!

#246 'Man of Corrows! What a Name"

Philip Bliss wrote both the words and the tune for this hymn describing the sorrowful things Christ had to undergo so that WE could have eternal life. Finally, in verse 5, we can almost see the gates of heaven as they open wide for His return for His church! The first 4 verses we sing sorrowfully, but the 5th is quite joyful. Listen as the organ helps to interpret the feelings conveyed by these words.
