


Dear Children,

We get to talk about some wonderful things today: welcoming others; hospitality; love; forgiveness; acceptance; grace; peace; love; joy; and hope!!! Who doesn't like to talk about ALL of that?!

Do you think you could memorize this verse?

Romans 15:13

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

Or, you could memorize it in this translation:

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Can you tell that God, your Father, wants you to experience in your life joy and peace and hope. He is, in fact, THE GOD OF HOPE!

But He doesn't want you to find it in family or friends or fishing or fun ~ those are all fantastic things!! But He wants you to find your hope in HIM!

One time I turned on the bath water and forgot about it. Ten minutes (maybe longer) I remembered, and I ran to the bathtub as fast as I could, but it was too late. Water was overflowing the tub all over the bathroom floor!!!

God wants YOU to overflow with His hope, and He does that for you by His Holy Spirit as you trust in His Son, Jesus.

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER! 10 EASY STEPS

- 1. Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- 2. Try really hard to make the same time every day.
- 3. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- 4. Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- 5. Sing a song or two together.
- 6. Take prayer requests.
- 7. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- 8. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- 9. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- 10. Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26

Meet the Davila Family Rodney, Jana, Christopher & Alyssa

Serving with
Mission to the World
in Costa Rica

Where do our missionaries live and work?

Rodney was born and raised in Costa Rica. He met Jana in Costa Rica while she was there learning Spanish. After they married, their first assignment was in Bogota, Colombia. Rodney trained men to be church leaders. Later they went to Chile where Rodney taught Chilean pastors and church planters through theological training, personal discipleship, and ministry experience.

In 2010, the Davilas moved back to Costa Rica, Rodney's home country. He is the MTW team leader and works with another missionary family. They are helping Costa Rican Christians form a Presbyterian denomination. There are four churches now, but they work with several other groups to help them start churches. Christopher and Alyssa are students at Covenant College, but when they are at home, they are Spanish translators for visiting missions trip teams.
