

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children.

You know what a "roll call" is, don't you? The teacher or coach calls out each name, and you answer, "Here!" or "Present."

As Paul is ending his letter to the church at Rome, he lists many people's names – like a roll call. These are all members of the church; therefore, they are all members of the church family!

And when Paul calls out names, we actually can learn a lot about what it looks like to be a Christian and what the church should be doing. One way we learn from Paul is by what he says about each person he names. For example, Greet Pricilla and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus. This tells they were his friends, they worked hard, and they were Christians.

Let me ask you: if Paul was listing your name, what would he say about you? If Paul were writing a letter to Trinity Church, and he mentioned you at the close of the letter, what would he "tac on" to your name to describe you? Hard worker? Friendly? Kind to others? One who loves Jesus?

I want you see #1 below, and do that exercise with your family. Do a "roll call" with you family, and say something about them that you love.


Paul sure did love his church. Do you? Your church loves YOU!!

#8	Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.	
#9	Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to	
	come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that	
	happened to them that day.	
#10	Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26	
	The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be	
	gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



John Gibbons & Erick Armster Fellowship of Christian Athletes - Alabama

Fellowship of Christian Athletes is a worldwide organization dedicated to sharing the gospel with coaches and athletes in schools and colleges. John Gibbons and Erick Armster were athletes when they were students and then felt God's call to serve Him by teaching and discipling other athletes and coaches. That is their job, but they also work with volunteers who serve at schools and sports camps. They meet with coaches individually and in groups to help them think about ways they can encourage their players to know Jesus and put their faith in Him. They also meet with basketball, baseball, softball, and football teams before practice and before games to pray with them. John and Erick also have weekly meetings with groups of students from different sports at public schools. These meetings are called "huddles" just like a football huddle except that these are Bible studies where students are encouraged to follow Jesus.
