



Good morning children!


We have a special guest in our pulpit today, Dr. Ligon Duncan from Jackson, Mississippi. Dr. Duncan is the Chancellor of Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson. Prior to becoming Chancellor at RTS, he was the Senior Minister at 1st Presbyterian Church in Jackson, which is the church in which Mr. Mac grew up. Dr. Duncan has also authored or co-authored about 35 books! He and his wife, Anne, are parents to 2 college students. This morning, Dr. Duncan will be preaching from Psalms 110.

How much do you know about the Psalms? "Psalms" means "book of praises." Psalms is a book of 150 songs of praise to God. We often sing a Psalm during our worship service at church. Many of the Psalms were written by David, or by his choir leader, Asaph. The Psalms have been divided into five books and is located in the Old Testament. Listen carefully today as Dr. Duncan preaches from Psalms 110. His sermon is entitled "King Priest Warrior" which is how David describes the coming Messiah.

Elementary kids, I hope you will join us for otLive during the Fall Bible Conference September 30th-October 2nd. otLive is a children's version of Walk thru the Bible that is a really fun and active way to learn the stories of the Old Testament. You won't want to miss it! There will be fun activities for our preschoolers too! Hope to see you there!

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

#1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family. Try really hard to make the same time every day. #2 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect. #3 Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional. #4 Sing a song or two together. #5 #6 Take prayer requests. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray #7 for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for. #8 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/ #9 or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/ hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day. #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26 The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



Adelaide, Schaeffer, Leo and Alexander Illman are our missionary children this week. They live in Cambridge, England with their parents David and Sarah who serve the Lord in a ministry there. The Illmans are members of our church even though they live far away.

Addie is in 6th grade. She starred as Hermia in the school play, "A Midsummer Night's Dream" and sings in a girls' choir. Schaeffer is in 4rd grade and is a Cub Scout. Leo is in 1st Grade. Alexander is only 3 years old so he goes to day care while their mom works part time at their school. The public schools don't talk about God in England so they walk to a Christian school near their house. They worship at Cambridge Presbyterian Church. It is smaller than Trinity Church with about 100 people in the service each Sunday.

Their family is looking for a new place to live because the house they have rented for the last 8 years will be sold. Please pray they find a new house that is affordable and close to their school.
