




How many of you have done something that you felt really bad about? Here are some examples: maybe you told a lie, maybe you took something that didn't belong to you, maybe you were mean to your brother or sister, maybe you said something about a friend that wasn't true, or maybe you disobeyed your mom or dad. How did you feel when you did this? It's quite possible that, at the time, you told the lie so that you wouldn't get into trouble with your parents so you were relieved at the moment. Now, as you reflect on what you did, how do you feel? I bet it made you feel bad inside.

Well, there's good news! God's Word tells us that, in Christ, we can be "new creations." Scripture also tells us that if we confess our sins and repent (turn away from our sin), God WILL forgive us!!

Since it's fall and I know you're seeing a lot of pumpkins around, let me give you a timely example of how God can change us by using a pumpkin. When you carve a pumpkin, you first pick the pumpkin out of the dirt then you wash the dirt from the pumpkin. 

After graduation from Auburn University, her passion for missions grew while she was part of a church planting team in Italy. Later, she worked with the Embers to Flame Church Revitalization ministry at Briarwood Presbyterian Church in Birmingham and then spent nearly 8 years in Uganda where she worked to strengthen the Ugandan Presbyterian Church, which is growing rapidly. Carolyn worked with a Ugandan lady to develop ministries for women like our Women in the Church and Sunday School programs for children.

She returned to the United States this past Spring and began working at the Home Office of Mission to the World. Carolyn uses all her experiences as a missionary to help train and care for other missionaries who serve all around the world.

#691"It Is Well with My Soul"

When Horatio Spafford wrote this hymn in 1873 he had just experienced a great loss in his family. He had already lost his son to Scarlet Fever and lost his wealth in the Great Chicago Fire, and in 1873 he lost his 4 daughters in a shipwreck. As he was on his way to meet his grieving wife he wrote this hymn, "It Is Well with My Soul." How do you react in times of trouble and sadness? Is your soul well in any circumstance? We should rest in the fact that the Holy Spirit is always with us and Jesus is always there to hear our prayers. This hymn is a great example of how, as Christians, we can have peace no matter what happens in our lives.

#598 "Guide Me. O Thou Great Jehovah"

The Lord Guides us. He is our "Bread of heaven," our "strong Deliverer," and our "strength and shield." If we seek Him He will feed us spiritually, He will protect us, and He will deliver us from evil. He will guide us down the path of life.
