


—Proverbs 29:25


Good morning boys and girls!

I want you to think about something: who is more important to please, God or man? I have a confession to make. I'm a people pleaser. I want everybody to like me all the time and I don't like it when I think a friend is unhappy with me. I think everybody wants to be liked and sometimes wanting to please people other than God can get us into trouble like the verse above tells us. A "snare" is a trap used to catch animals. It's usually hidden in the leaves and branches on the ground and the animal walks right into it without seeing it. By the time they've been trapped, it's too late. If the animal is to be set free, someone else has to do it for them!

The same thing happens to us when we want the approval of our friends, or the world, more than we want God's approval. The only way to escape the snare or trap is by doing things that are pleasing to God. How do we know what pleases him? We know that by reading and studying God's word. For example, do you remember what the fifth commandment is? The fifth commandment is, "Honor thy father and thy mother that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee." Exodus 20:12 In other words, he tells us that honoring our parents pleases him. Listening to and obeying our parents and teachers can help us avoid many snares!

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

#1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family. Try really hard to make the same time every day. #2 #3 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect. Read a Bible verse. 

Friendship Mission

Serving in Montgomery

Proverbs 19:17

Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and He will repay him for his deed.

This week's ministry is in Montgomery. Friendship Mission helps poor and homeless people by giving them a place to stay, something to eat, and an opportunity to hear preaching and teaching about Jesus. The Bible tells us in many ways that God cares for poor people and that we should too.

The ministry has buildings in two different parts of Montgomery. One building is just for men. The other building is for women and women who have children. Friendship Mission will let anyone stay for a few nights especially when it is very hot, cold or raining, but they will let some people stay for up to a year if those people really want to work and learn how to take care of themselves. They teach people that God expects us to work and be responsible for ourselves and our families. They also teach people how to do certain jobs and then help them find jobs so they can earn enough money to live. At the same time they are doing these things, the Friendship Mission staff and volunteers tell people about Jesus and what the Bible tells us how we should live

#599 "Savior, like a Shepherd Lead Us"

In the Bible, Jesus refers to Himself as a Shepherd. The writer of this hymn is asking Jesus to lead us, as Christians, like sheep. He asked Jesus to "feed us," "seek us when we go astray," "befriend us," and "receive us." In John chapter 10, Jesus says "I lay down my life for the sheep." Jesus not only feeds us, seeks us out, befriends us, and received us with open arms, but He also died for us. He gave up His life so that we could have eternal life with Him. Isn't it wonderful to be a sheep? Ask Jesus to be your shepherd and to guide your life!

#55 "To God Be the Glory"

This hymn reminds us of what Jesus has done for us. He "yielded His life an atonement for sin, and opened the lifegate that we may go in." Jesus gave His life for us so that we may be forgiven of our sins and live in Heaven with Him for all eternity. Did you know that Jesus doesn't just save good people? He will also save those who have done terrible things if they believe in Him. Verse 2 says "the vilest offender who truly believes, that moment from Jesus forgiveness receives."
