



Dear Children.

Have you ever stood on your tip-toes to see something?

I'm a tall man – 6 feet, 4 inches. So, I don't really have to stand on my tip-toes a lot, but I remember when I was your age doing it a lot. Maybe it was to see somebody pass by. Maybe it was to see a parade or a ballgame. Sometimes we all have to stand on our tip-toes to reach something.

HOPE is sorta like standing on your tip-toes. When you are standing on your tip-toes you are striving to see something or reach something. When you HOPE for something, you are striving to see something, have something or enjoy something – something you have wished for.

And when Jesus was born in Bethlehem, "hope was born." He came that we might have hope, faith, life, peace, love, a church family, Christian brothers and sisters.


I HOPE you have a great Lords Day and wonderful worship,

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

#1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family. Try really hard to make the same time every day. #2 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect. #3 Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional. #4 Sing a song or two together. #5 #6 Take prayer requests. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray #7 for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for. #8 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/ #9 or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/ hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day. #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26 The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



Steve & Sherri Letchford Serving with SIM International in Kenya At Kijabi Hospital

Steve is from Augusta, Georgia and Sherri is from Tyler, Texas. They have served in Zambia and Kenya since 2001. Steve is a medical doctor. When he first went to Zambia, he was in charge of the 200 bed Mukinge Hospital as a young doctor. He also led the missionary team there in Lusaka which is the capital city. In 2006, they moved to Kenya where Steve works as the Medical Director at the Kijabe Hospital. Steve and a team of people are developing computer software that will help African hospitals and small clinics manage their patients, medicines and staff.

Sherri is trained to be a physical therapist, and works with the physical therapy department in the same hospital. She teaches and mentors new physical therapists. In Zambia, Sherri homeschooled their children, but when they moved to Kenya, the children attended the Rift Valley Academy. Now, all their children are grown and their youngest son is in medical school.
