



Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

All the month of January we have been looking at ONE verse and focusing on FOUR words: return, rest, quiet, and trust. This morning we will look at what it means to TRUST GOD.

Do you know that every time you get on your bicycle or sit in a chair or ride across a bridge, you are showing trust. You are saying, I trust that the wheels on my bike are screwed in tight. I am trusting that the legs on this chair will hold me up. I am trusting that whoever built this bridge did their very best and did it correctly.

God is One in Whom we can put our complete trust! He can be counted on! He will never let you down. He Who made you will keep you and protect you. Even if you ask Him for something, and He says "no" or "wait," still, you will receive from Him MORE than you asked. He will always give you what is best.

And when you quietly put your trust and confidence in Him, you will find that that gives you strength (joy, hope, reason for living, grace).

You probably need to know too that this morning we will recognize some men who will serve us as elders and deacons. These are men who are gifted at shepherding us and serving us. These men (the elders) teach us, watch over us, pray for us, run to us when we are in trouble, are present when tragedy comes, and are behind the scenes praying and leading our church when we don't even know it. They are shepherds, and Jesus is the Chief Shepherd.


The other men (the deacons) are servants – a very high calling! Jesus was the ultimate servant, and these men act like Jesus before us. They take care of our church building and grounds; they make sure we spend our money faithfully; they help people in need; they show mercy to those who need mercy; they are very godly, spiritual men who put others ahead of themselves; they help the elderly and the widows and the poor; and these men too do so much behind the scenes that we never see ... but they did it.

It's actually a very exciting day in the life of our church. Communion is served tonight!

Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for. #8 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/ #9 or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/ hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day. #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26 The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



Meet Our Missionaries!



Meet David, Jill and Ruth Ann Martin Serving with Mission to the World In Odessa, Ukraine

David and Jill were raised in Christian homes and met when they were students at Covenant College. They taught in a school for missionary children in Peru for several years before coming back to the United States for more education. David taught physical science at Auburn University, Montgomery, but God had other plans for them and drew them back to the mission field.

In 1998 they went to Ukraine to start a school for missionary children because there is a large team of missionaries there to plant new churches. They live close to the part of Ukraine that was invaded by Russian soldiers. Things remain peaceful where they live, but they ask us to pray for the Ukrainian Christians during this time when their country is threatened. Their daughter Ruth Anne graduated from Covenant College and returned to Ukraine to teach in their school. They have two other adult children who live in the United States.
