



Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

This morning we are going to begin a brief series of sermons for six weeks on the last week of Jesus' life. I know you know that the final week of His earthly life started on Palm Sunday with the Triumphal Entry; He would die on the cross on Friday; and, He would be resurrected to life on Sunday. But do you know what happened during the rest of the week? I can tell you, A LOT happened!!

On Monday of that week, He left Bethany where He had been staying overnight at His good friends' home: Martha, Mary and Lazarus. On His way back to Jerusalem, He does a strange thing: He curses a tree, and He pronounces that that tree would never again bear fruit.

Kind of weird. He was hungry. The fig tree had no figs. He curses the tree. And the next morning, the tree is completely withered.

That story tells us a lot about ourselves and others. We are to bear fruit. The fruit we bear is spiritual, but we are to be bearing fruit. Some examples of fruit would be: (1) growing in your relationship to God; (2) loving Him more and more; (3) realizing more and more how much He loves you; (4) having an impact on others by being kind, serving, inviting them to church, telling them about Jesus; (5) general obedience to God is a way of bearing fruit. The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness and self-control.


People who claim to be Christians but do not bear fruit, are called hypocrites. Do you know what a hypocrite is? Someone who pretends to be something they are not. They say one thing, but they act in a different way.

Jesus' last week – and Monday of that week in particular – has a lot to say about these kinds of things. I hope you'll pay good attention this morning and learn something about Jesus you never knew before.

- 3. Is there someone you need to forgive? Who and why?
- 4. Jesus has forgiven you for everything you have ever done and ever will do. Do you believe that? Why is He able to do that? What motivates Him to do that?



Montgomery Jails

Let God Arise is a jail ministry in Montgomery with emphasis on evangelism and discipleship through God's Holy Word. It is led by Chaplain Tom Bridges, who attends Trinity Church.

Since September 1992, this ministry has visited and ministered to people behind prison bars in the Montgomery County Detention Facility as well as the city and federal jails in our city. A team of dedicated men and women volunteer with Chaplain Bridges. They go into the jails to preach, teach, and encourage the men and women who are prisoners. They also give Bibles and tiny radios to prisoners. The radios are tuned to Faith Radio, which is our Christian radio station here in Montgomery. Many of the prisoners realize they have done wrong and want to change their lives, so hearing the gospel gives them an opportunity to know about the Lord Jesus and how He saves people from their sin.

Isaiah 48:17 says "I am the Lord your God...who directs you in the way you should go." God will guide you in your life if you ask Him to. If you ever have a decision to make and you don't know what to do, pray for God to show you what to do. He might answer you through His Word or through a great sense of peace about the situation.
