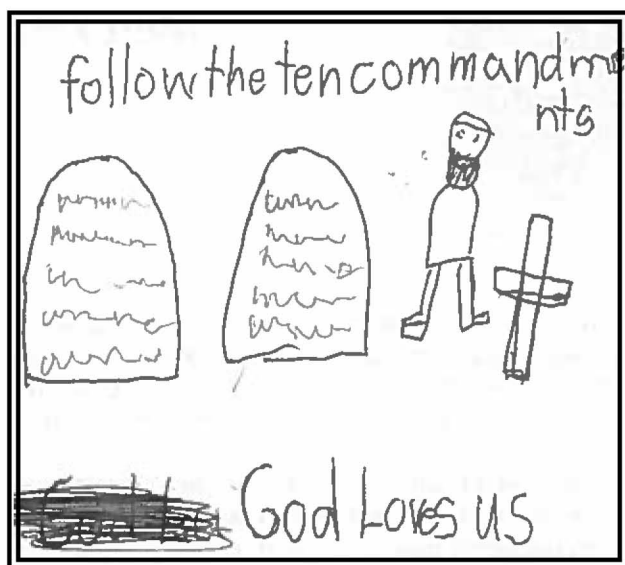


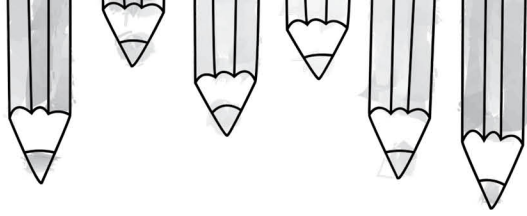

Just a word from Mrs. Stacy

Dear Children:

Good morning and happy Spring Break! When Spring Break arrives, you know that Easter is right around the corner. In preparation for Easter, our ministers have been preaching about the last week of Jesus' life, also known as Passion Week.

Today, Mr. Mac will preach about the events of Wednesday. We don't really know a lot about this Wednesday. In fact, it has been called "Silent Wednesday" because some believe that Jesus and His disciples rested on this day in preparation for Passover.

Matthew 26 tells us what was going on: an evil high priest named Caiaphas was plotting to kill Jesus, and Judas, a disciple no less, was also plotting against Jesus. Jesus was resting at the home of a man named Simon and a meal was taking place to honor Jesus. Jesus had healed Simon of leprosy, a terrible disease. Another fact worth noting is that there were only men at this dinner because men and women ate their meals separately. This is important because a woman named Mary suddenly walked up to Jesus and began to pour very expensive perfume all over Him. (This is the same Mary who sat at Jesus' feet to listen to Him while her sister Martha prepared dinner, which made Martha very angry.) In this culture, it was very strange and inappropriate for a woman to approach a man while he was having dinner with other men. It was almost like she knew what was about to happen to Jesus. On the other hand, the disciples definitely knew that Jesus was about to die because He had told them 3 times!

When Jesus' disciples saw what was happening, they became angry and called it a waste and said that the perfume could have been sold and the money then given to the poor. The most outspoken disciple about this was Judas-- who we know would go on to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver. Jesus, however, saw her act, her sacrifice, for what it was: an acknowledgment of who Jesus was and an acknowledgment of what was about to happen to Him. It was an act of worship, love, and adoration. She gave Jesus her very best.

I hope that we're all challenged today to worship Jesus by giving Him our very best. This means giving him the best of our time, talents, and resources by spending time with Him, studying His word, praying, coming to church, tithing, and trying to glorify Him in all that we do.

I hope that you have a wonderful Spring Break! This is a great time to finish your memory work, especially if you will be spending a long time in the car. The memory work deadline is Sunday, May 5th.


