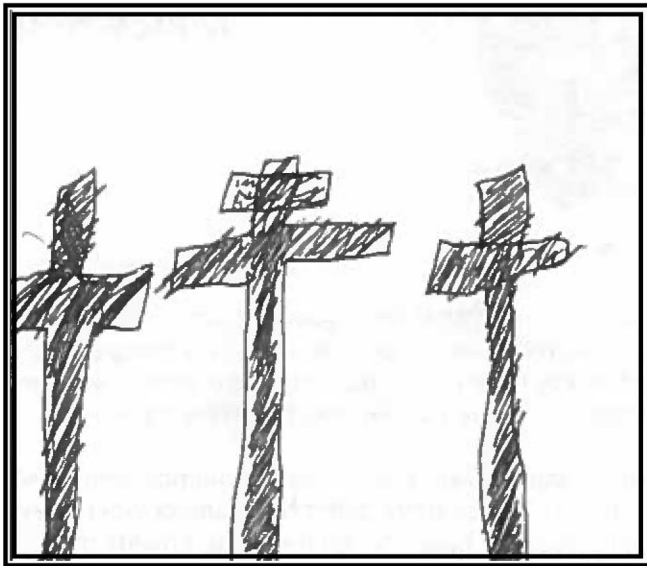


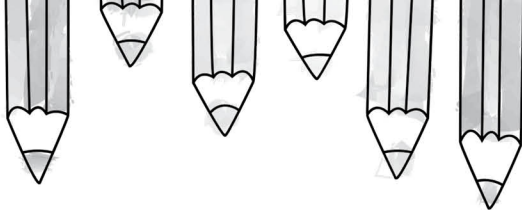

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Singing praises to Jesus Christ is one of the wonderful joys of knowing Him as our Lord and Savior. Out of our gratefulness, we cannot help but sing songs of praise to Jesus when we examine all He has done for us. Non-believers look for happiness in the things of this world: money, friends, possessions, etc. In time, they will see that these things will not fill the void they have in their hearts. We all have an emptiness in our hearts that can only be filled with Jesus. In fact, we were created for His joy, to praise Him, and to know Him.

This morning, we will be singing “Man of Sorrows! What a Name,” a hymn that beautifully expresses what Jesus has done for us as sinners washed by His blood. It says that Christ has reclaimed us and pardoned our sin; He is our full atonement. He is “now in heav’n exalted high” and will come again as our “glorious King” to bring us home to live with Him for all eternity because He loves us.

“Hallelujah! What a Savior!” is found at the end of each stanza. “Hallelu” in the original Hebrew means to praise someone, and Yah means God (Yahweh). So, Hallelujah simply means “praise to God.” By singing hallelujah to the Lord, we are praising Him for all He has done.

Verse 5 says that once Jesus brings us home “then anew this song we’ll sing.” Revelation 19 says that John witnessed the singing of “hallelujah” in heaven in his vision! As part of your testimony of praise, share your beliefs with everyone you know, talk to your parents about this hymn, and sing out this Lord’s day morning in thankfulness to Him, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!



Students in the Isaiah 55 Deaf School, Reynosa, Mexico

Emanuel and Gabriela are students at the Isaiah 55 School for deaf children in Reynosa, Mexico. They receive a scholarship from Trinity Church so they can attend that school. It was started by NoNo and Kate Beale who are Trinity members and missionaries in Mexico. Our Spring Break Missions Trip team worked at this school while they were in Reynosa this past week.

Deaf people cannot hear the sounds most people hear, so they cannot communicate by talking, but they learn sign language with their hands. Can you imagine not being able to talk with your parents or not being able to hear your parents say they love you? They also learn to read and write and all the other things you learn at your school, and they learn about God, why Jesus died and was brought to life again to save them from their sins, and bring them into a new life for God.

Emanuel is fifteen years old. His father is a blacksmith. His mother teaches at his school. His favorite foods are pizza, tacos and sandwiches and he likes to play video games. Gabriela is twelve years old. Her father works in a factory. Her favorite food is tacos and she likes jump rope. Will you write a letter to them? They would like to write back.
